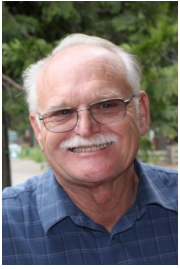

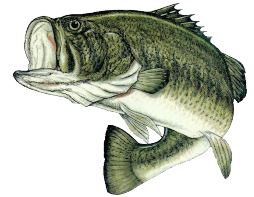

Last month we had a "Team Tournament" at Collins Lake on March 20th and lots of Bass were caught, but only one Trout was weighed in.

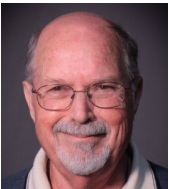
This month we have a "Tournament" at Englebright on April 20th. Fishing has been slow at all Local Lakes due to the cold water temperature.

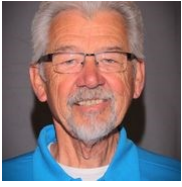
Dining Out: There is a change in the day of dining out for the month of April only. It will be on Wednesday April 26 at 6 pm at The Ranch House in Yuba City.
