Some Wine Myths Revealed and Dumped

Are you ready to face facts? Are you ready to toss wine myths into the dump bucket and move on with your life? Don't we just want to enjoy the right wine, right here, right now? Here's my list of wine myths. if you think of any more dumb myths that we should dump, clue me in.

Myth No. 1: All Rose' is sweet

The White Zinfandel craze in the 80's that converted the wine cooler fans to wine fans also made many consumers believe that all pink wine was sweet. Wrong! Real Rose' is dry and delicious with food. It is the beverage of choice in the summer months in southern Europe.

Myth No. 2: Screw caps are for cheap wines

We're not talking about Night Train or Thunderbird here. We're talking about quality closures for quality wines. Screw caps are the best seal for wine by eliminating the chance of a corked wine. Easy to open, no broken corks or gadgets needed. You can reseal the wine to save any leftover wine, or so I'm told.

Myth No. 3: Red wine with meat, white wine with fish

Sure, this is the fail-safe equation...but would you match a full blown-oaky-rich-buttery Chardonnay with a delicate dover sole? Would you pair a big young tannic Cabernet Sauvignon with veal marsala? I don't think so. Light reds like Pinot Noir or Beaujolais can work with seafood (salmon) and Riesling, Pinot Gris, Gewurtztraminer and dry Roses' work well with light or cured meats.

Myth No. 4: Pinot Noir good, merlot bad

The movie 'Sideways' is directly responsible for this myth. Miles' love for Pinot Noir increased the demand, pushing up the price. Trying to cash in, many wineries flooded the the market with weak, thin, schlocky and expensive Pinots. Merlot did take a dive but now they're a great value, especially compared to \$\$\$ Cabernets.

Myth No. 5 The more expensive the wine, the better the wine I have to admit I spent \$25(!!!) in a tasting of six 1974 Napa Cabernets in 1976 just after all the hype of the Paris tasting. I had to break into my piggy bank. It was great! My epiphany wine was a 1987 Caymus Special Selection Cabernet Sauvignon \$\$\$. But we had to share it with our wine club partners! So yes, they're good but many are way overpriced and over rated. The issue is affordability. I would rather have 5 bottles of sparkling Mumm's than one of Veuve Cliquot Champagne. Lodi Region #1 Takes Five Best of California Awards

The 2024 California Commercial Wine Competition results are in. I noticed Region #1 did very well. Best of California Awards went to Acquiesce Winery and Vineyard's 2022 Double Gold 99 points Bourboulenc and the 2023 Double Gold 99 points Grenache Rose' both from the Mokelumne River Appellation. The next three Best of California Awards were from the San Joaquin Appellation. They are Macchia's 2022 Double Gold 99 points Outrageous Zinfandel, St. Amant Winery's 2022 Double Gold 98 points Petite Sirah, and Oak Farm Vineyard's 2021 Double Gold Sangiovese. Also, the Best Value Wine in the competition went to Lodi's Collier Creek's 2021 Double Gold 98 points Merlot. Well done Lodi!

Sir State BEC Zoom Call on June 26th

On June 26th there was a SIR Statewide Zoom meeting involving any BEC member who wanted to attend. There were over 230 people on the call. Lee Lamp, the State Acting Director, moderated the meeting. He emphasized the great importance of SIR in helping retired men exercise their mind and body and to keep an active social life. Yet the organization, although formed in Northern California, in 1953, with that objective in mind, is still a relatively unknown organization in the retirement community. I listened in on the whole meeting, which lasted 2 1/2 hours, and I found it very informative.

Increasing membership is the single most important thing in keeping the organization going.

The medium average age of a SIR is 80, right now. Ten years ago, our total membership was 30,000---it is now 8400, with 80 branches. 1/3rd of branches are growing, some healthily so, adding as many as 50 members in one year; 1/3rd of branches are just holding their own;

1/3rd of branches are regressing. Two to 5 branches are merging each year. So what is being proposed to spur new growth and to be able to reach out to retired men who do not know about SIR? Some ideas proposed are:

- Change the organization name and the logo. (Definitely remove the rooster as the logo)
- Change the structure from "branches" to "chapters" of the State SIR
- Change the "Big Sir" to "President" and the "Little Sir" to Vice President
- Make clear tht the role of the State is to set strategic direction and inforce chapter bylaws.
- Eliminate the use of the word "retirement" in promotion and advertising. All men are welcome, with no age restriction. (Could be promoted as a Senior Men's Social Group".
- Possibly change the organization to a 501C3 organization, which makes it a non-profit charitable organization that can receive tax-deductible gifts and also can request grants. As a non-profit that opens up new avenues for advertising, such as in AARP literature, Chamber of Commerce publications, etc. One note is that we could not then exclude women, although there is no requirement that we solicit women for membership, since some chapters would not do so.
- Having a You Tube video that can be sent to anyone. (A sample, very professional video, already completed, was presented.
- Allow for on-line applications, and add the ability to sign men up for membership right from an I-phone.
- Zation
- Issue badges in recognition of recruitment successes.

Lee Lamp, stated: "Change is the only thing that is constant----change is needed to grow and flourish." "We have much to offer senior men, but we need to raise our profile in the community significantly. Input and ideas are welcome from all SIR members, so if you have some additional ideas how we can improve our organization, let one of the BEC board members know.
