

Any player wanting to walk the cost is \$23 and for any player wanting to ride the cost is \$37. It is hoped that in the future that cart fees will be collected by the golf course.

Don't forget the End of Year tournament is just around the corner. It will be held on September 26<sup>th</sup> at Manteca. This will be the last tournament that both Andre and I will host. Jay Norris still needs an assistant.

To qualify for a free lunch members must have played a minimum of 15 rounds between October 2015 and prior to the upcoming End of Year tournament (Sept 26<sup>th</sup>). I will have a list showing how many rounds each member has played posted on the bulletin board at the August meeting. Green fees still apply. Green fees for those who qualify for a free lunch is \$21 while those who do not it is \$29.

Because of our meeting change to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday our signup lists are the last to be received by the Handicap Chairman and Treasure. I am asking for an early signup for the End of Year because 1) to get a head count for the number of players who will be staying for the lunch and 2) to get our Branch ahead of the other branches so we don't have a problem with being behind the 8-ball as the number of players approach 144. A signup sheet for the end of year will be at the August lunch so please bring a check.

The Golf Committee has voted to give out a Range Finder as the grand prize. It will be the first item to be given out so that everyone has a chance to win. All other prizes will be more or less given out in a random order. To shorten the lunch the number of prizes will be limited or combined. Not everyone will get a prize.

This is to get members with high indexes to be more competitive and to try and level the playing field. The handicap chairman will make any adjustments where applicable.

NCGA member renewal dues are coming. We will start collecting NCGA dues starting in October. It is anticipated that the dues amount will remain the same \$45 if renewing and \$55 for new members.

The Golf Treasurer has requested that instead of returning checks for tournaments missed that he be permitted to shred them instead. With a show of hands from those present at the last monthly meeting it was agreed to allow the treasurer to shred checks instead of returning them. Check are not cashed until a player has played the tournament for which the check was written. Tournaments in which a player either is a No Show or Cancelled will have their check shredded. In the future no checks will be returned but will be shredded by the Golf Treasurer.

For those who are interested in the Reno outing Week One has been cancelled and combined with Week Two because of the lack of response. Those who signed up for Week One have been moved to Week Two.

Again I am getting incomplete information on the signup sheets especially whether a player wants to ride or walk. Remember if you leave it up to me you may not like what you get. Also when requesting playing partners I need the first initial and last name. First names alone are not sufficient. We have several members who have the same last name. If playing partner requests in the comment column is left off I assume by default that you don't have a preference of who you are paired with. It is also your responsibility to check with your requested partner whether they are playing or not and if they have request to play with someone else. I see a lot of request where the requested player did not even sign up.

As a reminder please be sure that the Ride/Walk, Check #, Amount Paid, and Comment columns are filled out and filled out correctly. Please write legibly so that your chicken scratch may be interpreted correctly.


