Message from Big Sir Jerry Strain



This month is election month of our Branch Executive Committee. The names of all those who have been nominated appeared in the July Newsletter. Since that time, we have a volunteer to act as Assistant Secretary in the name of Jack O'Brian. Thanks, Jack, for volunteering.

We are still looking for an Assistant Treasurer. Please consider volunteering

for this final position on the BEC. Sir is a volunteer run organization and without the volunteers we will collapse. These positions do not take a lot of time from your schedule. The only skill needed is a minimum of computer knowledge. Some simple spreadsheet work or a minimal amount of word processing to type up minutes or other small items.

Gentlemen, our membership in Branch 144 is declining faster than I would like to see. When I was Big Sir in 2011, our membership was approximately 225. Today our membership is 146, a decline of 35% over 8 years. Of that 146, only about 60% are attending our monthly luncheon meetings. We are continually paying for lunches we did not use. In June and July we have paid \$198 for lunches we did not use. This practice cannot continue. We have an obligation to The Season's for a set number. If you do not show, we end up paying for you.

When you joined Sir, we only asked two things. One, that you attend the luncheons, and two, that you pay the annual dues. You indicated that you were either retired or semi-retired, or otherwise available and that you could meet these obligations. <u>You are required to attend one-half of the regular Branch monthly luncheon meetings within the previous twelve consecutive month period</u>. Our lunch price is very reasonable and should not create a burden on anyone. There are Sir Branches who pay up to \$27 monthly and if they do not call to cancel, they are billed for the lunch. Our branch is seriously considering billing you if you do not call and you do not show.

This year is half over, and we still have 12 members who have not paid their dues. If you are one of these members (and you know who you are), we would appreciate the submittal of your dues.

I did not mean to come across with doom and gloom, but these are realistic numbers, and realistic problems we must solve within our Branch. We have a great number of good members who enjoy our luncheons and would like to continue. Help us make Branch 144 healthy again. I have faith in you as members and I know we can do better.
