# **SPEAKER**

Our August speaker is Robert D. (Bob) Woehl. He is the nuclear regional manager for the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) in Palo Alto. His presentation is entitled, "The Future of U.S. Nuclear Power in a Carbon Constrained World", and will cover sub-topics such as: the status of prospective new nuclear plants in the U.S., and, more specifically, California; why new plants should be considered, and the controlling factors in regard to alternatives; how global climate changes fit into the picture; and what new technologies are available now that were not before.

Bob is a Palo Alto native and electrical engineering graduate of the University of Notre Dame. He spent 24 years in the Navy, primarily as a submarine officer, and upon retirement, worked for PG&E at the Canyon Diablo Nuclear Power Plant in San Luis Obispo. After 13 years there he migrated to EPRI, where he has spent 10 yeas in his present capacity which focuses on assisting the 18 nuclear facilities in the west, and midwest, in application of EPRI's nuclear technology.

## Wed., 8/13 Open Source Software - Is There Really a Free Lunch? Maurice Green, PhD

From Linux, Open Office, Firefox and GIMP to a growing list of other applications Open Source has become a popular alternative to costly commercial software. Open source software is developed by a community of programmers with peer review and transparency of process. The promise of open source is better quality, higher reliability, more flexibility, lower cost, and an end to predatory vendor lock-in. Maury will discuss the open source process, its pros and cons and demonstrate a variety of applications which are freely available on the internet.

Maurice Green is the web-

master for SVUGA and group leader for the SVUGA digital imaging and web design SIGs. He teaches the web design course using open source software exclusively. He has been managing computer networks at Stanford since 1990.
