The program promotes Universal Accessibility and web standards compliance. Universal Accessibility means making content available to any user, regardless of how they may be able to receive it. It means conveying your ideas in such a way so that the content created can be re-purposed in many different ways without losing its meaning, intent, or usefulness; it focuses on making web resources compatible with the widest range of web browsing technologies. It's about getting the most mileage out of the work you produce, saving you time, effort and resources. As an added benefit, it also ensures that your material is also accessible to users who may be unable to access it in a traditional manner, including members of the disabled communities.
