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## **Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Board**

**February 24, 2010**

There being a quorum, Big SIR, Howard Trudeau, convened the meeting at 10:05 AM, at the Mountain View Shoreline Golf Course Pro Shop conference room.

The minutes of the January 27, 2010, meeting were approved without change.

The following reports were submitted: **BIG SIR**-Howard Trudeau:

The Nominating Committee advised that Ken Christie was almost fully recovered and would be willing to serve as Secretary assuming his health continues to improve. Ken thought he would be able to take over at the March meeting. It was moved, seconded and approved that Ken Christie become Branch Secretary effective March 24, 2010, pending his continued recovery. Emmett Hearn, a long time member and Director, advised that due to ill health he would not be able to continue his duties as a Director on the Branch Executive Committee (BEC). Among Emmett's many contributions to the BEC was his handling of the mailing of the Branch Bulletin.

Howard Trudeau made a motion that Fred Van Kirk be appointed to replace Emmett on the BEC. The motion was seconded and passed. Fred will take over the mailing of the Bulletin and work with Al Stratz, Membership Chairman, to coordinate which members receive the Bulletin via email vs snail mail.

The 2010 Membership Roster has been printed and distributed to the members of the BEC. Member's copies are available at the sign-in table. It is requested that each member check his listing for any errors and to report same to Al Stratz.

There are ten active members who are eligible for special recognition as Senior SIR (over age 90) and one member, over age 95, who is eligible for recognition as a Super Senior SIR. Ken Liddicoat will prepare special tags to be added to these members badges. The Big Sir will arrange to have special certificates prepared for presentation at a future meeting.

Members attention is directed to the recent issue of "SIR HAPPENINGS" for an article about the State Big SIR, Buck Kendrick, whom many of the members know. It can be found by going to SIR Inc.org.

Anyone interested in running for a State SIR office must apply by April 1. See the Big SIR for details.

Big SIR received information from the State Executive Committee regarding Branch insurance requirements. He is looking into this matter at the present time and will report back to the BEC.

**ACTING SECRETARY**-Fred Van Kirk-Nothing to report.

**TREASURER**-Don Harryman:

The cash balance as of January 31, was \$6,338.09. The cash balance at the start of 2010 was \$6,111.76.

Only 43 out of 99 active members have as yet to make their 2010 contribution. The annual contribution of \$25.00 should be sent to Don Harryman ASAP.

Zeke Sicotte has completed his internal audit of the Branch 5 financial reports for the year 2009. He has found that the reports accurately present the bank balance of \$6,111.76 at December 31, 2009. He also found the records maintained by the Treasurer to be in excellent order. It was moved, seconded and passed to accept the Auditor's Report. It was also moved, seconded and passed that in the future a Golf Fund Financial Report be submitted to the BEC at the end of each year and that it be Audited with the Treasurer's report. (Thank

Ray Odell advised that he would have a Budget for 2010 prepared for the March BEC meeting.

**LITTLE SIR**-John Geibel:

At the last minute the Little SIR was advised that the speaker he had scheduled would be unable to attend the meeting. John was able to secure an able replacement on short notice.

We are looking for a speaker for March. Please contact John if you have any suggestions.

John is also looking for members who would like to be on a speakers committee.

**MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN**-Al Stratz:

There are currently 99 active members and 5 inactive members. Our current mailing list indicates we are sending out 128 Newsletters per month, 89 by email and 39 by "snail" mail.

**ATTENDANCE CHAIRMAN**-Ray Odell:

Our total attendance at the January meeting was 57 and 4 guests. This is the best attendance we have had in months.

**TRAVEL CHAIRMAN**-Joe Ames: Nothing to report.

**GOLF**-Wayne Richter:

Wayne had a box of various SIR pins, bolo ties and buckles of which he had become the custodian. There was discussion of what should be done with these items. It was decided to present these to members on special occasions such as those receiving a free lunch on their birthdays.
