I recently received a letter from SIRinc Chairman, "Buck" Kendrick discussing Resolution 1-2010, SIR New Member Recruitment Directive. The SIRinc Board of Directors has noted that the total membership of SIR branches has declined from about 32,000 members in 1992 to about 20,000 members at the end of 2009. Thirty branches have closed since 1999, 13 during the last 3 years. The Board is placing more emphasis on recruiting new members and has

# Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Board

#### April 28, 2010

With a quorum present BIG SIR, Howard Trudeau, convened the meeting at 1006 at the Mountain View Golf Shop Conference room.

The minutes of the March 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting were accepted without change. Mr. Ray Odell was provided with a spare copy of those minutes.

#### **BIG SIR Howard Trudeau:**

- 1. BIG SIR received an urgent message from the state nominating committee apprising him that the long time State secretary was departing. An urgent request for a nominee to fill that position was made. Any interested candidate should complete Form 43 and submit it to the state board for consideration.
- 2. Buck Kendrick sent a letter to the BIG SIR describing Resolution 1-2010 which is a directive for the purpose of recruiting new members. Each branch will submit Form 27 (enclosed in Buck's letter) for each monthly meeting that details the attendance and new member identification. Membership has declined from a peak of 32,000 to the present count of 20,000 and the organization must take steps to counter this trend. The board welcomes any ideas for recruiting new members, particularly in the area of attracting the "baby boomer" generation who are reaching retirement age.
- 3. Little SIR will miss the May meeting and provided BIG SIR with information on the speaker, Mr. Ethan Winston.
- 4. The July bar-b-que planning is moving on schedule. It was decided to drop the sausage entrée on the basis of lack of interest and modest cost savings. Chicken and ribs will be the only meat dishes available at the bar-b-que. A sign up sheet will be at the main desk at the June lunch so we can get a count for the bar-b-que.

5. The Branch 5 nominating committee is close to completing their list of nominees. A new opening came up when Mr. Joe Ames announced that he will be leaving the travel directors office soon. Joe has been our travel chairman for FIFTEEN years and will be sorely missed. His marketing and organizational skills made SIR travels worthwhile and thoroughly enjoyable adventures.

On a more somber note, Mr. Howard Hushbeck is undergoing three dialysis treatments a day and will be unable to perform the new member name tag trinket preparation or any other branch function. Art Kraemer will take over these duties.

#### Officer Reports

Membership – Al Stratz – Branch 5 has 98 active members. One passed away recently and we inducted a new member this date. Therefore, our overall headcount remained the same.

Treasurer – Don Harryman –A number of members have not made their yearly contribution to date. Your secretary is one of the delinquents, but the check will be in the mail before the end of this month. Don is setting up a new checking account and is negotiating with banks to get the best deal available.

Web Site – Ed Nazal – Ed has the new SIR format ready for inspection. He would like to get a few photos of the Branch 5 officers.

Remembrances – Art Kraemer - Art received approval to send condolence messages to the widows of a few recently departed members. The board decided that messages would be more appropriate than flowers.

The first tour I escorted was a New Year's cruise in the Western Caribbean on

December 29<sup>th</sup> 1995.

We will have had a total of 1074 Travelers go on our tours.
