Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Board

September 25, 2013

Meeting was called to order at 10:08 AM. A quorum of BEC board members was present. In attendance were Al Stratz, Big SIR; Art Schmid, Little SIR; Pete LoPresto, Treasurer; Art Kraemer, Assistant Treasurer; Fred Van Kirk, Director; Ken Liddicoat, Director; Duane Stauffer, Attendance; Paul Butler, Membership; Greg Kemist, Director; Howard Trudeau, Assistant Secretary; Ed Nazzal, Webmaster: George Kranen, Director, Region 5; and Paul Krug, Secretary.

The minutes of the June 19 meeting were approved as written.

George Kranen, Director of Region 5 will be a guest at today's meeting.

Big SIR Al Stratz distributed the Form 27, Monthly Branch Membership Report through August. There are 70 active members and 1 inactive member. Meeting attendance in September was 49 or 70%.

The year's goal for 2013 is to enroll a minimum of 7 new members. To date we have attained 6, leaving one more member to be recruited to meet the 2013 goal. To assist in recruitment, brochures that list SIR activities will be ordered that can be given with the invitation card to prospective members.

The speaker for November 20 will be Rick Deutsch, who will discuss "The Great Wall of China."

Treasurer Report: Pete LoPresto reported five members have not paid this year's contribution. The quarterly assessment by SIR of \$1.25 per head was paid by the Treasurer, based on 69 members.

Total paid meals last month were 49, with 2 non-paying for a total of 51. Total year-to-date profit is \$339.12

Membership Report: Membership is stable at 69 with one inactive.

Old Business:

The Holiday Lunch to be held on December 11, and will have four menu selections; roast beef, salmon, chicken, and vegetarian. A \$30.00 lunch price was decided. A fee of \$200 was allocated for entertainment by the Geezers and \$250 was allocated for

Ed Nassal reported the Branch website is up and running.

Art Schmid attended a Little Sir training meeting in Vallejo and gave a summary of the subjects covered.

The call for adjournment was approved and the meeting adjourned at 10:48 AM.
