## **SPEAKER**

Gizela Zebroski will be speaking on THE BERLIN AIRLIFT

In 1948 Stalin blocked all land passages to the Western Zones of Berlin. That resulted in his taking 2.3 million people hostage. He wanted to get the Western Allies out of Berlin and take charge of the city. Truman understood that if he gives up Berlin, he would also have to give up Western Germany. "No way will we surrender what American men fought and died for. We shall stay." Thus he faced the showdown between communism and democracy. The talk explains the circumstances under which this battle was won as well as the the story of Hal Halverson, the Candy Bomber. His gift of two sticks of chewing gum to the children of Berlin resulted in a peace offering between the American people and Germany. They became allies fighting a common foe.

That's the story in a nutshell.

**Ride:** We will ride the Coyote Creek Trail starting from the Four Points Sheraton Inn at 399 Silicon Valley Rd, San Jose. The ride will be about 6 miles to the Coyote Creek Golf Course. We will go past the golf course another 3 miles to a model airplane launching site, then double back to the golf course club house for lunch. After lunch we will ride back to the hotel parking lot for a total of 18 flat miles, round trip. For those who want a shorter ride, they may omit the ride to the airplane site, thus reducing the round trip to 12 miles.
