SPEAKER

Santa Cruz SIR Greg Horne describes the trip he took to Tanzania with his brother to climb Mt. Kilimanjaro. Set in the midst of tropical grasslands, Mt. Kilimanjaro is Africa's highest peak, and the tallest freestanding mountain in the world.

Greg compares walking up Kilimanjaro with walking in one week from the Equator to the Arctic. Passing through 5 distinct climate and vegetation zones, the climb progresses from equatorial rainforest through temperate forest, heathland and alpine desert to the snow-capped, perpetually frozen summit. At 19,340 feet above sea level, it's certainly a challenge, and one that defeats more than half of those who attempt it. But it's not a technical climb, and with proper preparation can be managed by fit trekkers of

all ages.

Greg's PowerPoint presentation includes background on the mountain, details of the preparations he made for the trip, and many photographs taken on the climb from the forest to the summit.

---COME RIDE WITH US)

The SIR Branch 35 monthly bicycling is a combined activity with all SIR Branches in Area 16. The objectives of the monthly rides are to continue to promote fellowship, share experiences, get some exercise and above all, have FUN! Planned SIR rides are announced in each SIR Monthly Newsletter and by email to all interested members. The rides are on the 2nd Thursday of each month. Wives and guests are welcome. All that a bicyclist needs are a bike,

bicycling helmet, and a jacket or vest, if it is windy. Rain will cancel the planned ride. We ask that all participants exhibit a positive attitude, exercise good judgment when riding such as maintaining a safe distance between riders, obeying all traffic signs and stop lights, etc.

There are 9 standard SIR bike trails (all very scenic) from South San Jose to South San Francisco and from Half Moon Bay to Fremont all between 15 to 20 miles round trip on paved, level bicycle trails. Some trails will have optional 4-5 mile extensions. The riding pace is moderate between 9-12 mph depending on oncoming headwinds. Riding on streets is kept to a minimum. Planned rides will have short restroom/water breaks and lunch is at a known restaurant at the halfway point of the ride.

Some of the SIR bicyclists have been experimenting with establishing a 4th Thursday of the month ride. This ride will be more unstructured with the objective of finding new, paved and safe biking trails to add to the standard 9 SIR ride list. Some of these new trails may be outside of the Immediate Bay Area. The riding pace is a little faster depending on the riders, bike trails are new to the riders so there may be some backtracking and are not always well marked/identified so it makes for a more adventurous ride. #### **Mountain View to Alviso**

The Ride: We begin the ride at the La Avenida Trial Head and follow the Stevens Creek Trail for 1.5 miles where we connect with the BayTrail. We continue the ride 3.5 miles on the levees and old service roads as we cross the waters north of Moffett Field. (Note: This portion of the Bay Trail has been resurfaced and is not bumpy as before) We then head for Sunnyvale Baylands Park where we do go on packed gravel to downtown Alviso, where we will have lunch at a restaurant. The ride is 9.5 miles one way. We will return on the same route for a round trip of 19 miles. There are no optional shortcuts.

<u>Directions</u>: Meet at the La Avenida Trail Head at the end of La Avenida Ave. From the intersection of Hwy 101 and ShorelineBlvd, head north on Shoreline Blvd. toward the Computer Museum. La Avenida is the first

street on the right, but you can't turn there as it is a oneway street. Instead go past the Computer Museum to Pear Ave; turn right. Ingo Way is the next street; turn right. La Avenida is the next St.; turn left. (It is a two-way street here). Go four blocks to the end of the street. Park on the street, next to the curb.
