Drones: Love'em or Hate'em

Tom graduated from Cal Berkelev and retired from NASA-Ames Research Center after 37 years where he worked with the wind tunnels, simulators, computers, and flight test aircraft. Much of that work was on remotely piloted vehicles (RPVs) or "drones" as they are called now. He is currently studying and flying quad copters with interest in package delivery. He will discuss this exciting field and the concerns of citizens, regulators and entrepreneurs. The presentation will use slides and videos of quad-copters. hybrid winged quad-copters and other concepts. Several aircraft will be on display including some flown with virtual reality goggles that use an on board video camera and a transmitter to let you feel as if you are in the vehicle. The presentation will cover a little history, some contemporary civilian and military "drones", as well as a glimpse into possible future aircraft.

# SUMMARY OF BRANCH 5 Executive Board MINUTES

SIR Branch 5

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes March 22, 2017–10:00 AM

Call to order - The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m.

Confirm quorum of six Board members - A quorum was confirmed. In attendance were Chris Vasquez - Secretary, Roy Dreisbach - Little Sir, Foster Kinney - Big Sir, Paul Butler - Membership Chair, Fred Van Kirk - Guest, Al Stratz - Speaker Chair, Pete LoPresto - Treasurer, Don Andrews - Assistant Treasurer, Carl Orta - Director,

Gary Hornberger - Activities Director, Dan Haley - Greeter, Tom Donahue -Attendance Chair, Phil Yurtis, Les Spring – Newsletter Chair.

Additions or correction to minutes of February 22, 2017 BEC meeting and approval - The minutes were approved with the acknowledgment that Foster's name was misspelled.

Introduction of Visitors and Guests - Fred Van Kirk was introduced as a guest.

Big SIR reports:

2017 is the Asian Year of the Rooster - Anything we can do with our Rooster to capitalize on this? Post Office has Rooster stamps - Foster displayed a page of rooster stamps, which he will be using for correspondence during the year of the rooster.

Guests - Any guests for Lunch? - There were no guests scheduled for today's lunch. Foster will continue to encourage membership to bring guests.

There are no inductions this month. It was announced that Russell Currier passed on March 18th. Foster stated that Phil Yurtis would be giving the presentation to the new members after the April meeting. Foster said that he would get Phil the list of the new members. Foster stated it would be good for the BEC members to attend as well. Foster said that he is going to do a monthly raffle with prizes going to those members whose tickets are drawn and who bring their recruiting cards.

Pete also passed out the 2017 fore-cast versus YTD actuals that is attached. The total income items forecast is \$15,545. The actual income items to date are \$3290. The forecasted expense items are \$15,376. The actual expense items to date are \$1983.47.

All agreed that we are tracking well. Committee Reports:

Attendance – Tom Donahue - Tom reported that attendance at our last meeting was 33 with one guest and one speaker. Tom reported that five members are over 10 years perfect attendance including Paul Butler, Cal Cook, Pete LoPresto, Jack Raymond and Les Spring. Tom reminded everyone to make sure they put correct badge numbers on the sign in sheets. Gary stated that in the past he handed out ribbons for perfect attendance. Tom and Gary will work together to identify names of members, and Gary volunteered to procure the ribbons.

Bulletin – Les Spring - Les reported that the newsletter deadline remains at the end of the first week of the month or seven days into the month. He stated that he sends one reminder, and then publishes the newsletter. Foster asked if the schedule of events goes into the newsletter and Les responded yes, if he receives it. Roy stated that he will do the monthly birthdays and Paul said that he would send this information to Roy. It was encouraged to send this information as well to Les so that he

SIRS ON BIKES: SIR Area #16 bike rides regularly start at 11:00 AM the 2nd Thursday of the month. Wives and Guests are welcome. Bring bike, helmet and a jacket if it is windy. Rain will cancel. Attendance averages 10-15 riders. More are welcome. Rides are planned to be 15-20 miles on paved bicycle trails (so that almost any type of bike is usable) with some optional ride distances. The pace is moderate and riding on streets is kept to a minimum and includes a restaurant lunch

break. Participants should exercise good judgment such as maintaining a safe distance between riders, obeying all signs and stoplights etc.

Ride: We will ride the flat Foster City Bay Trail for about 10 miles from the Oracle Headquarters to the Poplar Creek Golf Club at Coyote Point for lunch, and then return (approximately 20 miles round trip). It might be windy, so bring a jacket or windbreaker.

Directions: Get off Highway 101 at Marine Parkway/ Ralston. Turn right on Marine Parkway, then an immediate left onto Oracle Parkway. The meeting point is a tree-shaded parking lot with restrooms to the left of this intersection. If the parking lot there is full, backtrack over the creek to 401-501 Island Parkway and park in the Oracle lot. Ride your bike across the pedestrian bridge to the meeting point.
