# SUMMARY OF BRANCH 5 Executive Board MINUTES

May 24, 2017-10:00 AM

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 10:07 AM

Confirm quorum of six Board members: There was not a quorum at the time the meeting was called to order. In attendance by the end of the meeting were Chris Vasquez, Pete LoPresto, Gary Hornberger, Roy Dreisbach, Paul Butler, Tom Donahue, Bob Simons, Al Stratz, Dan Haley, Phil Yurtis and Greg Kemist. **Additions or correction** to minutes of April 26, BEC meeting and approval: The board approved the minutes of April 26<sup>th</sup>.

Introduction of Visitors and Guests: Roy announced there would be one guest at the luncheon, Don Strumbo who is a guest of Roger Teeter.

#### **Big Sir reports:**

Roy passed out a flyer (attached) for Sons in Retirement theater day to occur Sunday, June 11 at 2:30 PM at the Fox Theater in Redwood City.

Roy reported that Duncan MacVickar, the area governor, will be attending the June meeting and will present senior SIRS certificates, which Foster has ordered.
