# SUMMARY OF BRANCH 5 Executive Board MINUTES

February 22, 2017-10:00 AM

- 1. Call to order the meeting was called to order at 10 a.m.
- 2. Confirm quorum of six Board members A quorum was present. In attendance were Chris Vasquez, Carl Orta, Roy Dreisbach, Paul Butler, Gary Hornberger, Pete LoPresto, Foster Kinney, Albert Stratz, and Greg Kemist.
- 3. Additions or correction to minutes of January 25, 2017 Foster highlight the misspelling of a name in the minutes. The minutes were approved with that comment.

  4. Introduction of Visitors and Guests Fred Van Kirk was introduced as a guest
- 5. Big SIR reports:
  - a. Foster stated we needed a motion that all activities for 2017 in the Roster and the Newsletter are approved by the BEC. He stated this is needed to satisfy SIR insurance coverage.

It was so moved and approved by the BEC.

- b. Big SIR attended Region 5meeting in San Mateo on Feb. 17Foster reported this meeting was successful.
- c. Officer Training, 1300 S. El Camino, San Mateo, Friday, February 24, morning or afternoon sessions for all officers Foster reported that there is officer training this coming Friday and the information has been previously sent. Foster encouraged all of the applicable officers to go.
- d. Why SIR? This Branch has good food and good speakers. Invite your friends. Foster reiterated that he would be communicating that this branch has good food and good speakers and encourage the membership to invite their friends during the meetings.
- 6. Secretary's Report Chris Vasquez Chris had no items to report.
- 7. Treasurer's Report and approval Pete LoPresto Pete reported income is \$2160 and expenses were \$1213.47. Pete stated the gain was \$946.53. He said the dues paid to date are \$1,110. This equates to 74% of members paid. Pete reported that 14 members are still unpaid and one may possibly drop. There was a discussion about the summary of the minutes to still continue to go to the newsletter. It was decided that budget detail would continue to not be reported in the newsletter. (Budget detail attached)
  - a. Proposed Budget for 2017 –
     Pete passed out and spoke to the proposed budget forecast

for SIR-5. During the discussion, Pete highlighted he had liquor that he planned to donate to some events. There were appreciative comments from the board. The forecasted budget was approved. (Forecast attached) Foster inquired of Chris if his band might be interested in playing for an event, and Chris responded he would check with his band mates. Foster stated that Greg Kemist would be the administrative assistant to the president to handle some administrative duties. He stated Greg would continue to procure get-well cards and also handle other various administrative duties. Members can request cards to be sent via an email to Greg. It was decided that Greg would send any bills associated with procurement of cards to Pete for disposition.

There was discussion about allowing members who have assistants (who assist in mobility) to accompany them to meetings. It was reiterated that this is fine and the assistant will be the guest of the member who they assist.

#### 8. Committee Reports:

Attendance – Tom Donahue -Tom was not in attendance. Foster reported for Tom that we had 43 members in attendance at the last January meeting and one guest.

Membership - Paul Butler – The membership report is attached. Paul reported no new members, no resignations, one

at the Coyote Hills Park and continue on the Alameda Trail to Niles where we will have lunch at a restaurant in downtown Niles. The ride is flat and approximately 9 miles each way, with an optional loop of a scenic view of the bay that adds about one mile (a total ride of 19 miles).

Directions: Take Highway 84 across the Dumbarton Bridge past the toll booth to the first exit, which is Paseo Padre Parkway. Turn left and go one mile to Paterson Ranch Road; turn left. This is the entrance to Coyote Hills Park (there is a small sign). Go 1/2 mile to the park toll booth (\$5 per car or use your East Bay Regional Park District season pass).

Some of the SIR bicyclists have been experimenting with establishing a 4th Thursday of the month ride. This ride will be more unstructured with the objective of finding new, paved and safe biking trails to

add to the standard 9 SIR ride list. Some of these new trails may be outside of the Immediate Bay Area. The riding pace is a little faster depending on the riders, bike trails are new to the riders so there may be some back-tracking and are not always well marked/identified so it makes for a more adventurous ride.
