Speaker

Looking Up And Looking Down: Marc Shargel Points His Cameras Into The Sky And Under The Sea.

Marc Shargel began diving as an undergraduate student at Stanford University in 1978. A few years later he gave up spearfishing in favor of underwater photography and began showing his photos professionally in 1988. As a teenager, he learned to develop and enlarge his own photographs in a darkroom, but it was the images he encountered underwater that motivated him to return to photography. Shargel has dived all along the California Coast from Humboldt County to San Diego and in oceans around the world. Marc Shargel earned degrees biology and psychology at Stanford but began his career programming computers at Apple.

In decades of diving, Shargel has noticed slow but relentless decreases in marine life. In 2000 he co-founded the first of two marine conservation organizations along California's Central Coast that he helped to lead. From 2004 to 2006 he served on a state panel charged with doing something that had never been done before: to protect a network of marine habitats along the Central Coast by mapping out a series of marine reserves—like state parks in the sea—to function as refuges and nurseries for everything living in our ocean. The state's process to make the

network of marine reserves state-wide continued on to other regions, and so did Shargel. He began to create coffee table books, to communicate visually to decision makers and the public exactly what the proposed areas could protect. In 2008 his first book of photography, Wonders of the Sea: North Central California's Living Marine Riches, was published. He has since published two more volumes in the series, on Far Northern California and Southern California. Most recently he published Yesterday's Ocean: A History of Marine Life on California's Central Coast, a soft-bound booklet. All his publications are available at LivingSeaimages.com
