
Palm Sunday will be March 25, Good Friday on March 30 and Easter is early this year, on April 1, and that is no April Fool!

The minutes of January 24, 2018, BEC meeting were approved after one correction. 4. Gary introduced Bob Fox, Regional Director, as a guest. Foster gave Bob kudos for bringing all the

big SIR leaders together for the sharing of information, which continues to work well.

a. Budget forecast for 2028 Pete passed out the forecast, which is attached.

Pete reported that income was \$1805 with \$1288.19 in expenses. He reported that the January gain was \$516.81 Pete stated that compared to year-end 2016 we are starting the year better this year and are over the minimum necessary in our checking account. 

## Coyote Hills / Alameda Creek –- Niles/ Fremont

<u>The Ride</u>: We will begin the ride at the Coyote Hills Park and continue on the Alameda Trail to Niles where we will have lunch at a restaurant in downtown Niles. The ride is flat and approximately 9 miles each way, with an optional loop of a scenic view of the bay that adds about one mile (a total ride of 19 miles). <u>Directions</u>: Take Highway 84 across the Dumbarton Bridge past the toll booth to the first exit, which is Paseo Padre Parkway. Turn left and go one mile to Paterson Ranch Road; turn left. This is the entrance to Coyote Hills Park (there is a small sign). Go 1/2 mile to the park toll booth (\$5 per car or use your East Bay Regional Park District season pass). Continue another 1/2 mile over several speed bumps to the park office and museum; park there.
