Well, well, here we are in October, the first full month of Fall. Check out the Fall Color - liquid amber trees, some in full bright colors, some still green and may wait until February! The colors are almost as bright as the maple trees that bring such vivid colors to New England in early October. (The generic name, Liquidambar, means, literally, "liquid amber" and refers to the pleasant-tasting resin that the tree exudes when you peel away the deeply furrowed bark. It was once used commercially for making soaps, adhesives and drugs.)

The October Full Moon comes on Wednesday, October 24 this year and is known as the Full Hunter's Moon (also the Dying Moon and the Travel Moon.) This lunar phase marks the height of our autumnal bounty before the scarcity of winter sets in. This full moon is also at the apogee of the moon's irregular orbit around our Earth, the farthest point away. So this is the smallest moon this year. Take a look - it appears a lot smaller and dimmer than the big, bright Super Moon that you saw on January 31.

We had a nice SIR-5 Day at the Giants on September 12, even though the Braves won 2-1.

Twelve of our members attended. This is one of our favorite branch events, so we look forward to next year and hope for a better score!

SIR Branch 5 Executive Committee Meeting Minutes September 26, 2018–10:00 AM

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 10:10 AM.
- 2. A quorum was confirmed. In attendance were Chris Vasquez, Pete LoPresto, Carl Orta, Foster Kinney, Roy Dreisbach, Howard Trudeau, Paul Butler, Phil Yurtis, Albert Stratz, Bob Simons and Tom Donahue.
- 3. There were no visitors or guests.

4. The minutes of August 22, 2018 were approved.

5. Big SIR report:

a. Foster welcomed back the Little Sir Roy Dreisbach. Bob Simons and Gary Hornberger attended the Big Sir meeting on the 14th. Bob stated the following key items from the meeting. He stated that many complained about their catering providers and he said that Ken Newton wants to get forms 27, 28 and the BEC minutes and the newsletter from each branch every month. He provided Ken's email address. It was decided that Ken can glean the minutes from the newsletter and it was recommended that he be added to the newsletter distribution list. He mentioned that another Big Sir from another branch talked about a speaker who gave a talk on the Tucker automobile. which he reported, sounded good. Bob offered to get the contact information if we were interested. He reported that the quarterly Big Sir meetings will be held on the last Friday of the month and they will be no more Big Sir meetings this year. He stated that he alerted Ken about the HLM nomination coming up. He stated that the state president gives these out so we would have to make arrangements for him to come in advance. Foster reiterated that we have good food and good speakers at Branch 5, which is a good selling point.

Bob also stated that Ken was interested in a spreadsheet of all of the activities of all of the branches. It was stated that we are interested in information on any photography groups. Foster indicated that information is online but Bob said that it's very hard to get to.

6. Secretary's Report – Chris-Vasquez had nothing to report.

7. Treasurer's Report and approval – Pete LoPresto passed out the treasurer's report (attached.) He reported that we had \$775 in income, \$999.34 in expenses with a loss of \$224.34. We also have a year to date gain of \$267.46. He reported that we have a balance of \$2300

8. Pete also reported the

attendance figures for the last meeting of 31 members present, 1 member attending from branch 35 and 1 speaker for a total of 33.

9. Foster reported that he has 11 bottles of wine for the December event and mentioned that JW Whittier will have three prizes, possibly including bowls for the December celebration. Pete reported that he has a large container of gin as a prize. Foster reiterated that our general policy is to have door prizes equal to half of the number of those in attendance. It was also decided that we would purchase 100 pens, red body, black ink, a sample of which Pete had brought forward. The cost agreed upon was \$95. We will discuss distribution for those pens at a future meeting. Foster mentioned that the amount for 2019 dues will be determined before the end of the year as we approach 2019.

9.Attendance – Pete reported out the attendance figures in the treasurer's report.

10. Membership - Paul Butler reported no new members and no resignations. Paul also stated we have no current applications in process. Foster stated that he would contact members in November that may be considering dropping out, to help ascertain their status. (Membership report attached.)

(Sometimes we go along the airport road to another place to eat. This adds about 5 more miles to the total). We will return to by the same trail back for a total ride of about 18 miles. Directions: Take I-280 north approximately 15 miles to Highway 92, then take the exit to Half Moon Bay. Continue on Highway 92 about 10 miles to the intersection with Highway 1, turn left. Go about one mile to Poplar St., turn right. Go to the end of Poplar St and park in the Poplar Beach parking lot, near the port-a-johns. Parking there will have a fee, so some find parking in the streets near the beach parking. Driving time is about 45 minutes. It may be windy and cold, so be sure to bring a wind breaker and gloves to wear.
