# ."Climate Change, Impacts and Solutions"

Sudhanshu "Suds" Jain designed integrated circuits for 25 years. In 2008 he decided that the impending Climate crisis was far more important than designing the next switch chip for computer networking and he "retired" from Broadcom Corporation to become a "professional volunteer". He currently is working on improving the science curriculum at his son's middle school. He also coached a FIRST Lego League team for 5 years and the high school FTC team at Wilcox High School for 3 years. He currently serves on the City of Santa Clara planning commission.

He also serves on the Board of Acterra.org. He has performed free home energy audits with Acterra's Green at Home program. He has also installed solar panels on low income housing with Grid Alternatives. He's active with Citizen's Climate Lobby which advocates for a Carbon Tax with 100% revenue recycling (dividends to consumers).

Since Sept. 2011, he's been teaching a "Climate Change Science" class to middle school students at Discovery Charter School. Sudhanshu holds BSEE and MSEE degrees from MIT.

# SUMMARY OF BRANCH 5 Executive Board MINUTES

August 22, 2018–10:00 AM

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m.
- 2. A quorum was confirmed. In attendance were Chris Vasquez, Pete LoPresto, Carl Orta, Albert Stratz, Paul Butler, Howard Trudeau, Gary Hornberger, Foster Kinney, Dan Healy and Bob Simons.
- 3. There were no visitors or guests.

4. The corrected minutes of June 27, 2018, BEC meeting were approved.

#### 5. Big SIR report:

- a. Foster stated there will be a Big Sir Area 13 meeting, Friday, September 14 in San Mateo Gary Hornberger volunteered to go to this meeting. Foster stated that he would send Gary the agenda. Foster went on to describe the four regions in the state and the nine branches.
- b. Annual Meeting Report Foster reported that insurance was a big item of discussion at the meeting. He also reported that members are no longer required to be retired and a possible new slogan was discussed which was "Men's Social Club".
- c. The new members who recently have joined are Steve Parsons in February, John Lakstigala in March and Lee Dove in May. Foster reported that John would be inducted today. Mountain View to Alviso Ride: We begin the ride at the La Avenida Trail Head and follow the Stevens Creek Trail for 1.5 miles where we connect with the Bay Trail. We continue the ride 3.5 miles on the levees and old service roads as we cross the waters north of Moffett Field. We follow the trail to downtown Alviso where we will have lunch at a restaurant. The ride is 9.5 miles one way. We will return on the same route for a roundtrip of 19 miles. There are no optional shortcuts. (There are some optional ways that have streets). This ride can be ridden on a road bike, but there is packed gravel and some prefer a wider tire bike. Directions: Meet at the La Avenida Trail Head at end of La Avenida Ave. From the intersection of Hwy 101 and Shoreline Blvd, head north on Shoreline Blvd. toward the Computer

Museum. La Avenida is the first street on the right, but you can't turn there as it is a one-way street. Instead go past the Computer Museum to Pear Ave; turn right.. Ingo Way is the next street; turn right. La Avenida is the next street.; turn left. (It is a two-way street here). Go four blocks to the end of the street. Park on the street, next to the curb.
