John Feece's Personal Biography

John grew up on a farm in Illinois. He spent the summers driving tractors and bailing hay. John started taking flying lessons in high school. He went to college at Southern Illinois University and was president of the school Flying Club and president of NIFA (National Intercollege Flying Association). The NIFA sponsored the National Intercollege summer air meet in 1963. After the NIFA air meet John was hired by Ozark Airlines and flew the Douglas DC

In 1965, he was hired by Pan American World Airways to fly out of San Francisco as a navigator/relief pilot for two years, then to copilot on the Boeing 707 for eight years. He then flew as a Boeing 747 copilot for eight more

He flew out of New York as captain of the Douglas DC 10, flying to the Caribbean and flying charters to Europe. He then flew the Lockheed L 1011 out of New York, followed by flying the Boeing 747 out of Los Angeles. Flying for Pan Am he traveled the world.

In 1986 United Airlines purchased the pacific routes from Pan Am and John went, with the sale, to fly the L 1011.

John went on to become a line check airman on the L 1011, and the Boeing 767 and 757. John retired from United after flying the Boeing 747 400 for three years.

Through all the years flying for the airlines John also flew and owned many airplanes of his own.
