# <u>Summary of Branch 5 Executive Board</u> Minutes

### SIR Branch 5 August 28, 2019– 10:00 AM

- 1. Meeting called to order at 10:02 AM.
- 2. A quorum of six board members was confirmed. In attendance were Chris Vasquez, Pete LoPresto, Howard Trudeau, Paul Butler, Gary Hornberger, Roy Dreisbach, Bob Simons, Foster Kinney, Dan Haley and Tom Donahue.
- 3. The BEC meeting minutes of June 26, 2019 were approved.
- 4. Roy stated that Steve Tremulis would be the guest speaker today and John Layman who was originally scheduled to speak will be speaking in November. He stated that Steve is a retired medical device engineer with over 50 patents. He said that Steve would speak on auto design and talk about his uncle who was chief designer of the 1948 Tucker automobile.

#### 5. Big SIR reports:

Roy stated the October meeting was changed to Oct. 30 at Michaels' request.

Roy said that at the state meeting Ed Benson gave a good presentation, which had been distributed. Some at the table stated that they had reviewed the 71-page presentation. Roy stated the meeting was held in Lincoln, California, and both he and Bob Simons attended the day of the meeting.

- 6. <u>Secretary's Report</u> Chris Vasquez had nothing to report.
- 7. Treasurer's Report and approval Pete LoPresto stated that the July barbecue income was \$1200 with 40 paid attendees. He said that we were billed for 43 attendees at a cost of \$1134.82. Additional expenses such as candy and framing brought the total expenses to \$1263.47 for a July loss of \$63.47. Breakdown of attendance was 24 members, 18 guests (2 unpaid), and 1 speaker for a total of 43. Pete stated the speaker; her mother and Ed Benson were unpaid. Pete said that he has noted 45 members for the month of July and that Anwar Dughman is going to be readmitted. A question was raised about a member who has not attended in a while, on readmitting him. It was determined that the final letter to this member had not been sent. Foster volunteered to talk

to this member and Foster stated that this member is on the list for callers to contact. The attached treasurer's report was approved.

### 8. Committee Reports

Attendance – Tom Donahue reaffirmed Pete's numbers for attendance and thanked Jerry Ely for the collections and collecting the attendance sheets. Tom also presented a two-page attendance report for 2019 that shows individual member attendance at the meetings, (attached).

**Membership** - It was moved and approved to accept Anwar Dughman into the organization. Paul Butler reported the active number of members is 46, which includes Dughman. His report is attached.

**Activities** - Gary reported that Bocce is in need of a venue because Los Altos is redoing their senior center so there will be no bocce until further notice.

Howard reported that golf is going well and there is no golf scheduled for this fifth week of August. He stated he is working on scheduling at four golf courses for next year and mentioned the prices are up just a little bit, a dollar or two.

- 9. <u>Old Business</u>: Gary reported that attendance was high at the recent Los Altos wine festival and the booth was very busy. He reported that all of the tri-folds were given out. He also reported that there were no sign-ups and called into question the value of attending the wine festival. All agreed it was good to get the information out.
- 10. New Business: Foster reported that he is the new Area Governor elect and that he anticipates being asked to do a lot of training. He stated he will carry forth the interests of the local Branches. Gary presented Howard with a framed photograph of Howard receiving the honorary lifetime membership award. All commented that it was a great photograph. Foster presented a list of proposed 2020 officers, which is attached. The list of nominations was accepted. It was mentioned that Chris Vasquez agreed to go on the nomination list but indicated that he would be not be serving as secretary for next year.

It was reported that Lester Spring indicated that he is going to step down from doing the newsletter next year. Roy stated we need a volunteer, preferably familiar with Microsoft Word in the PC Windows environment. It was also reported that volunteers are needed for telephoning members prior to the meetings.

It was also reported about the importance of insurance given the recent incident where some northern Branch members and their families suffered food poisoning from a caterer
