# Welcome Home

#### **In-Person Meetings:**

Yes, we are going to meet in-person this month. Do you remember the last in-person meeting? Try August 2021. Anyway, here are some details regarding the next luncheon and beyond.

The luncheon will be \$27/person which will be collected at the door. Your COVID waivers should have been submitted to the branch by now. If not, don't forget to bring it with you and your vaccination card. Masks are optional. Unfortunately, after April the luncheons will be \$30/person due to the cost of inflation, supply chain demands and labor.

Also, starting in April, yearly dues will remain at \$25. Dues can be paid at the luncheon with cash or by check to Sons In Retirement, Branch 51 Also, one can mail the check to Kingsley Wood, 1009 Forest Court, Palo Alto, CA, 94031. Deadline is July  $1^{\underline{st}}$ .

Other branch news is that the summer BBQ/Picnic is on for Wednesday, the 6<sup>th</sup> of July at the pool-side location of FHCC. The cost is expected to be \$30 per person. Spouses or guest are welcome to join the picnic. The menu is yet to be finalized, but it is expected to have chicken, ribs, and a side dish. Beer and wine will be available for purchase. When final pricing is determined, this newsletter will provide definite prices and the menu along with a separate flyer to remind members to sign up for the picnic.

#### COVID-19 News:

The nation is hopeful that the coronavirus is getting under control. However, the new COVID-19 virus variant, BA.2, is taking over from the Omicron/Delta variant. About 55% of new infection cases are the BA.2 variant which is more contagious than the Omicron variant, but with less hospitalization and death occurring.

We need to be on alert with regard to continue practicing good preventative measures to avoid this new variant or any future variants.

In the Bay Area, we are fortunate that most local counties have removed mask requirements, except for transportation hubs (on planes, in airports, on trains, buses, etc.) and for health care workers.

The on-average daily infection rate is down to 48,000 people from last month's ~150,000 on-average daily infections. Good news!

The FDA just approved an optional, second booster shot for improving vaccine immunization due to waning effectiveness of the prior vaccinations. The approval is for people over 50 years old and for the immunocompromised individuals who both had their last booster shot four months or more ago. The CDC needs to weigh in on this FDA recommendation. There is some controversy over whether people need a fourth shot depending on their existing immunity. The consensus is that a fourth preventative shot is worth it. Here are updated data from the Mayo Clinic records for COVID-19 for the US and CA as of the 28<sup>th</sup> of March 2022.

#### National vaccinations:

Fully vaccinated: 65.5% At least one shot: 76.9%

#### California vaccinations:

Fully vaccinated: 71.1% At least one shot: 82.5 %

Let us hope that in 2022 better health conditions will prevail for our ourselves, our families, and our friends.
