COVID-19 News:

The infection cases for the variants of COVID-19 are decreasing in the US to an average daily count of 154,000 cases as of $22^{\underline{nd}}$ of July, 2022. The dominant subvariant is BA.5. Unfortunately, there is a new subvariant coming out of India that is called BA.2.75. Let's hope this is not as bad as BA.5.

In addition, new infections from Monkeypox, an African virus, are being seen in our country (approximately 3,900 cases to date) and throughout the world, are complicating the health of individuals. The Monkeypox is not an airbornespreading virus. Skin contact with an infected individual generally transmits the virus. Most individuals that get infected are gay men. However, contact with objects that have been touched by an infected person (surfaces, clothes, towels, etc.) can relay the virus to others. Fortunately, the infection rate is low, it is much less contagious a virus, less severity of illness, and we have Smallpox vaccine that is useful to prevent infections, provided there is adequate supply for the susceptible individuals.

Being fully vaccinated and boosted for COVID-19 and its variants is still the best protection from becoming seriously ill.

For the US, over one week, from July $15^{\underline{h}}$ to June $22^{\underline{nd}}$, the percentage change in new, average daily cases has decreased by 12%. California has an approximate decrease in average daily cases of 8%.

Remember, even if you are fully vaccinated, it does not guarantee that you will not get infected by the virus. It means that if you do get infected, a successful and healthy outcome is highly likely.

Here is California updated data from the Mayo Clinic records for COVID-19 as of the 23^{rd} of July 2022 for fully vaccinated individuals: 73.0%.

Bottom line, protect yourself and others as best as you can.
