COVID-19 News:

The infection cases for the variants of COVID-19 are decreasing in the US to an average daily count of approximately 83,000 cases as of 25^{th} of August, 2022. California data from the Mayo Clinic records for COVID-19 as of the 25^{th} of August 2022 for fully vaccinated individuals: 73.7%. The dominant subvariant is BA.5. There will be new vaccines for this fall from Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna to cover COVID-19 Omicron and its subvariants, BA.4, and BA.5.

Monkeypox News:

In addition, new infections from Monkeypox, an African virus, are being seen in US at approximately 17,400 cases and world-wide approximately 47,650 cases as of 26th August 2022 per Mayo Clinic. Fortunately, the infection rate is low, it is much less contagious a virus, less severity of illness, and we have Smallpox vaccine that is useful to prevent infections, provided there is adequate supply for the susceptible individuals.

Bottom line, protect yourself and others as best as you can.

Speaker Name and Biography:


William Turner:

San Lorenzo Bay Trail Ride:

Ride: The ride starts from San Lorenzo passing by the Oakland International Airport to Bay Farm Island in Alameda. It is a very scenic, bay front trail that's paved and level (including 1-2 miles of quiet residential streets and 2-3 miles of Alameda city streets securely barricaded from traffic, about 22 miles round trip. We will stop in Alameda for lunch and then ride back to our starting point. The trail can get a bay breeze so bring light windbreaker or vest. This ride is much like the Oracle Redwood Shores ride, but on the East Bay.

Driving Directions: From Silicon Valley take I-880 heading North, exit on Hesperian Blvd (about 20 miles from Mt View/Palo Alto) turning left on to Hesperian Blvd, then right on Grant Avenue and turn right into the trail parking lot (near the end of Grant Avenue). Plug Into your car GPS: 2561 Grant Road, San Lorenzo. This will direct you the building next to the trail parking lot.
