### June 26 Luncheon Speaker Review

On this date we were treated to a spirited discussion on the subject of Levi Strauss and his world famous blue jeans company by Lynn Downey, an absolute authority on the subject. Lynn worked for the Levi Strauss Company for twenty-five years as company historian and archival consultant and has published many books and articles on Levi Strauss. She brought with her copies of her 2016 book, *Levi Strauss: The Man Who Gave Blue Jeans To The World*, and sold them all after our luncheon! Fortunately, much is known about Levi Strauss and his company so I won't review it all here. You can easily look it up on the internet. What I found most interesting were the anecdotal tidbits Lynn offered us that might or might not be in the book. For example, all of Levi Strauss's diaries and company records were lost in the 1906 earthquake and fire, so Lynn had to do a lot of research and detective work to reconstruct Strauss's life and the company's history. Levi was born in Bavaria in 1829. To escape religious discrimination, he and his whole family left Germany for New York City where they established a dry goods business. In 1853 Levi moved to San Francisco to sell goods to the gold rushers, and he was very successful. Then in 1872 he got a letter from Jacob Davis, one of his customers in Reno, Nevada. Davis was one of the inventors of riveted denim pants, but he didn't have the means or scale to mass market them on his own, so he partnered with Levi to produce blue jeans which they patented in 1873. The rest is history. Strauss and Davis sold a lot of jeans and received government contracts. By adding copper rivets and belt loops and various pockets, they made jeans, or overalls as they were often referred to, even more popular. (continued)

But not popular enough for Levi to wear, according to Lynn. Fact: he never wore jeans! But a lot of other folks did, and when he died in 1902, his personal wealth was around six million dollars. In today's money, that's 170 million. Strauss was very generous and funded many charities, especially children's causes, orphanages, and education. Much of his estate was left to charities.

I got curious about some of the words we encounter when we talk about jeans, so I did some dictionary research. "Jean," usually used in the plural, is short for *jean fustian*, a fabric made in Genoa ("Gene"), Italy in the 16<sup>th</sup> century. "Fustian" is "a strong cotton or cotton and linen fabric usually having a pile face and twill weave." Now, on to "denim." Denim can be traced to the French "serge de Nimes" (1695) which gets shortened to "de Nimes" or, in English, *denim*.

So what is denim? Webster says it's "a firm durable twilled (usually blue) cotton fabric woven with colored warp and white filling threads." But what is "serge"? Well, according to Webster, it's "a durable twilled fabric having a smooth clear face and a pronounced diagonal rib on the front and back." Finally, "cotton duck" is a term used to describe the material jeans are made of. What is "duck?" "Duck" is "a durable closely woven usually cotton fabric." I think we get the idea! Keep all of this in mind when you go shopping for jeans. There are a lot of them out there, all claiming superiority and exclusivity. But there's only one Levi's branded jean. Look for the little red Levi's tab on the rear pocket! Lynn tells us that she bought the oldest authentic pair of Levi's in existence (from the 1880's) on E-Bay for the Levi Strauss archives for the tidy sum of \$46,500. Not bad for an item that originally sold for around \$3!

Thanks, Lynn, for your fascinating presentation.


