

SIR JIM SMITH

- FRIEND

IT IS MORE DIFFICULT TO WRITE ABOUT A CLOSE FRIEND THAN SOMEONE I REALLY DON'T KNOW WELL. IN THIS CASE, I FIND SIR JIM'S LIFE STORY TO BE QUITE INTERESTING ESPECIALLY WHEN I CONSIDER WHY THINGS HAPPENED THE WAY THEY DID.

JIM WAS BORN AUGUST 1940 IN A HUMBLE TOWN OF HENRYETTA, OKLAHOMA. HE WAS BIRTHED IN HIS GRANDFATHER SMITH'S HOUSE. HIS DAD WAS 20 AT THE TIME AND WORKED AS A BELLMAN AT THE LOCAL HOTEL.

IN MAY OF 1942 JIM'S DAD HITCH-HIKED TO ARVIN WITH 50 CENTS IN HIS POCKET, (TALK ABOUT HUMBLE)! GUESS WHERE HE WORKED? DIGIORGIO FARMS, OF COURSE, AS MANY CAME INTO CALIFORNIA STOPPING

TO WORK THE FIELDS EAST OF BAKERSFIELD. HIS JOB WAS PUTTING ICE INTO RAILCARS AS THEY HAD NO REFRIGERATION TO KEEP THE FRUIT, VEGETABLES, MEAT COLD DURING THE TRIP TO THE EAST COAST. FOR THOSE IN FARMINBG THIS IS A COMMON KNOWLEDGE STORYLINE.

SOON JIM AND HIS MOM CAME WESTWARD. THEIR FIRST HOUSE WAS THE STYLE BUILT TO HOUSE FAMILIES WORKING IN THE OIL FIELDS: USUALLY BUILT ON A RAISED PLATFORM OF WOOD FLOORING, 3 FOOT WOOD SIDES, AND A CANVAS TOP. HOT IN THE SUMMER AND COLD IN THE WINTER; SUCH COMFORT!

FOR THE MOST PART JIM GREW UP IN OILDALE WHILE HIS DAD WORKED IN OIL DRILLING RIGS AROUND THE STATE TRYING TO MAKE A LIVING. JIM WENT TO BEARDSLY ELEMENTARY AND STANDARD SCHOOL. HE GRADUATED 8TH GRADE IN 1954 AND MOVED TO SHELL BEACH WHERE HIS FATHER WORKED FOR UNION OIL. JIM GRADUATED FROM ARROYO GRANDE H.S. WHERE HE EXCELLED IN ALL THE MATH CLASSES.

DURING THE 1959-1960 PERIOD JIM WENT TO BAKERSFIELD COLLEGE, WORKED SUMMERS AT MADONNA CONSTRUCTION, SANTA MARIA SHOVELING SAND AT A GRAVEL PIT.

CONSTRUCTION DWINDLED AND JIM FOUND HIMSELF ENTERING THE U.S.AIR FORCE. DURING BASIC

AND TECH TRAINING AT SHEPHERD AFB, HE WAS TESTED FOR SKILL LEVELS AND SCORED HIGH IN ADMINISTRATION AND ANALYTICS. JIM REQUESTED ASSIGNMENT INTO ACCOUNTING AND FINANCE, BUT THE USAF SAID, 'OUR NEEDS ARE MORE IMPORTANT THAN YOUR DESIRES!'; SO, HE WAS ASSIGNED TO DATA PROCESSING (DP).

FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO REMEMBER THOSE DAYS DP INVOLVED THE IBM CARD READERS AND SORTERS WHICH OFFERED FAST PROCESSING OF AN EXPANDED FIELD OF DATA. THIS WAS THE BEGINNING OF THE COMPUTER AGE. ALSO, AT THIS TIME, 1961, THE BUILD-UP OF TROOPS AND EFFORTS IN VIETNAM WERE SUBSTANTIAL AND THERE WAS A NEED FOR A WAY TO MANAGE THAT DATA, ESPECIALLY OUT OF TRAVIS AFB. OF COURSE, THAT IS WHERE JIM WAS SHIPPED AND HE WAS TOLD YOU ARE NOT GOING ANYWHERE ELSE, THE USAF NEEDS YOU HERE.

DURING HIS TOUR JIM WAS EXPOSED TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF MAG TAPE AND DISC'S USED IN DP AND STORAGE. FINALLY, HE 'TOURED OUT' JANUARY 1965 TO PERSUE HIS GOAL OF BEING AN ACCOUNTANT. SO HE TOOK HIS FIRST JOB AT MONTGOMERY WARDS IN OAKLAND, WHERE HE FOUND HIMSELF MANAGER OF DP CONVERSION FROM PUNCH CARD TO DISC. NOT ONLY

WERE THE MILITARY INTO CONVERSION BUT THE ENTIRE COUNTRY WAS FACING SUCH A NEED ALSO.

WHEN THAT WAS DONE, JIM FOUND A NEW JOB AT COMPUTER USAGE CORP. AS A CONSULTANT AUDITING AND MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS TO CUSTOMERS ON THEIR INFORMATION SYSTEMS. FIRST CLIENT WAS WESTERN STATES BANKCARD, A CONSORTIUM OF CROCKER BANK, SECURITY PACIFIC, AND WELLS FARGO BANK. THEY WERE CO-DEVELOPING A NEW CONCEPT: MASTER CARD. AS THIS DEVELOPED JIM WAS SENT TO MANHATTAN NEW YORK.

JIM THEN FOUND HIMSELF WORKING FOR PHYSCHOLOGICAL TESTING COMPANY WHICH USED ANALYTICS TO SELECT AND TRAIN STOCK BROKERS.

HOWEVER, JIM MOVED BACK TO SAN FRANCISCO AREA WORKING FOR CONTINENTAL DATA SERVICES BUREAU WHO PROVIDED DP AND ACCOUNTING SERVICES FOR SMALL BUSINESSES. SMALL BUSINESSES COULD NOT HANDLE THE DAY TO DAY DATA MANAGEMENT FOR THEIR BUSINESSES. BY NOW JIM WAS QUITE SKILLED IN THESE SYSTEMS AND HE FOUND GOOD JOBS MORE READILY AT HAND THAN MANY APPLICANTS. THIS ALLOWED HIM TO FINISH COLLEGE WHERE HE GRADUATED WITH A BACHELOR'S DEGREE STATING "BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION; option Accounting".

IN OCTOBER 1976, JIM AND HIS WIFE CHERIE MOVED TO BAKERSFIELD WHERE JIM JOINED THE KERN COUNTY WATER AGENCY WHICH AT THAT TIME WAS ACCOUNTING FOR 13 DISTRICTS AND HAD 13 FINANCE BOOKS TO MAINTAIN. GUESS WHAT? JIM HAD EXPERTISE IN DP WITH DISC AND MAG TAPE PROCESSING! HE TOOK LEAD ON CONVERSION SELECTED NCR EQUIPMENT, AND THE TYPE OF SOFTWARE THAT WOULD HANDLE THE TYPE AND AMOUNT OF DATA THEY WOULD BE PROCESSING.

JUST A SIDE NOTE THAT JIM WAS ALSO SUPPORTING A FAMILY AND ASSISTING HIS WIFE CHERIE IN HER EFFORTS TO DEVELOP A HOME FOR UNWED YOUNG GIRLS WHO WERE THROWN OUT ON THE STREETS BY THEIR DISGRUNTLED PARENTS. THIS WOULD COME TO BE KNOWN AS 'AUNT CHERIE'S HOME' AND BECAME THE SPECIAL NEEDS RECIPIENT FROM MANY LOCAL LEADERS. THIS IN ITSELF IS AN AMAZING STORY OF HOW FAITH CAN MOVE MOUNTAINS. ASK JIM HE WILL TELL YOU HOW.

JIM FINALLY GOT HIS ACCOUNTING JOB WITH BAKERSFIELD CHRISTIAN LIFE CENTER, THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF BAKERSFIELD, WHERE HE WORKED FOR 19 YEARS AND RETIRED.

SHORTLY AFTER THIS JIM'S WIFE CHERIE
SUCCUMED TO THE DETERIORATION OF RHEUMATOID

ARTHRITUS. JIM LATER MET AND MARRIED HIS CURRENT WIFE HELEN. THEY HAPPILY CARE FOR AND SUPPORT EACH OTHER AND A LARGE COMBINED FAMILY.

ALTHOUGH JIM REALLY ONLY WANTED TO ESTABLISH HIS OWN ACCOUNTING BUSINESS HE FOUND THAT EVERY TURN WAS FUNDED BY BUSINESSES WHO NEEDED TO CONVERT TO DP SYSTEMS. AND, ALL THIS STARTED BECAUSE OF THE USAF AND JIM'S ANALYTICAL THINKING.

JIM WILL TELL YOU THAT ALL THESE JOBS CAME AT A TIME WHEN THERE WAS A DEFINITE ECONOMIC NEED AND IT WAS NEVER BY LUCK. HE CONSIDERS THAT EACH JOB CAME BY DIVINE APPOINTMENT. JIM ALSO SAYS, "GOD IS IN CHARGE OF MY LIFE". AND, THAT'S HOW HE LIVES.
