MEET SIR KEITH MONTGOMERY



Keith Montgomery has been a distinguished member of SIR since January 2011, over 14 years of dedicated service to Branch 163. During this period he has held both Little Sir and Big Sir positions and is currently Nominating chairman along with Richard Weigelt. Keith reminded me the Nominating committee is made up of one or more past Big Sir's serving three- year rotations and he has been at it since 2013! Keith enjoys his service but says, "it's time for others to step up and take the reins". Actually, he put it this way regarding the leaders of Branch 163, "After a long and meritorious service the directors want to step down so others can step up to serve"! NOW THAT'S A CALL TO ARMS!!!

In this photo you will see a portion of family photos from Keith and Lynn that date back to early 1800's and back to many locations in this country some I never heard of. I call this their 'Wall of Honor' remembering the many who went before them. They have included many of these distant family members into their many travels throughout this country making cemetery visits to each one. Keith shows a lot of pride in his family genealogy remembering what they must have gone through as they traveled from back east to the west coast experiencing one hardship after another. This is something I can't really imagine nor explain to my family but it was the courage that defined them. What amazed me was Keith's memory of most of the people in the photos, as though it was just yesterday! I know much of this would bore some of you but I find it extremely captivating.

Keith was born in Bakersfield July 23, 1941 and has logged in some 84 years now even though he looks maybe 70ish! His dad was in the oil industry during the war years after which he spent 44 years working for J.C. Wattenbarger Supply.

Keith attended Standard School and North High where he played the Baritone and participated in sports, although games prevented him from marching. His real love was sports where he excelled in football, swimming, and wrestling during his 1955-1959 seasons. As a senior Keith earned the Wrestling Champion 165 Pound class and the Sam Lynn Trophy for the outstanding senior athlete.

After graduation Keith went to Bakersfield College where he majored in business and worked part-time for Standard Stations Inc. He transferred to Fresno State majoring in business marketing. He and Lynn were married in November 1967 with their 58th coming up this fall. CONGRATULATIONS!

Keith went to work full time after graduating driving a 'package truck' for Standard Oil. He delivered oil products to anybody who would sell them: new and used car dealers, service stations, repair shops, etc. Keith said he enjoyed this job except for when an

order was called into the office after he left on his route. Of course, he wouldn't find out about this until he got back to the office and he would have to make a separate run, all because there were no cell phones available!

Keith was transferred to the Stockton Standard Oil office and worked there 1968-1969 and then resigned because of their policy of obligatory transfers which are always hard on the family. He had in the back of his mind that he would like to be an educator. Now back-track a few years to 1963-64 where he had joined and served in the Coast Guard on a Cutter ship out of Long Beach. Because of that duty Keith was eligible to enroll for 'Earn while you Learn' program offered by California Lutheran College.

Now we are back in Bakersfield where Keith taught at Standard School District from 1969 to 2002. He retired with 33 years of investment in children's futures. He still gets a 'thank-you' when he sees a former student; a tribute to 'making a difference' in a child's life.

Just because you are retired does not end one's learning. Keith and Lynn have been traveling this country and Europe for 23 years after retirement and have loved every one of them. If you want to know more about any country ask Keith, he probably can give you the details.

High lite of his life? Raising two beautiful daughters and two grand daughters, plus 58 years of marriage to Lynn.

Thankyou Keith for setting the example of kindness and goodness in your work, dedication to your family, as well as supporting SIR Branch 163.

As a side, Keith distinctly remembers signs "Wait Station" but did not know what they referred to. An historical marker referred to the town as 'Waits' which later became known as Oildale. This was new news for me; how about you?

LOCATED AT 2401 N. CHESTER AVENUE
(NEAR BEHN) AND CAN STILL BE
SEEN AT 201 MAIN STREET, 5.
