Greetings,

January weather has been pretty mild and fishing has been good on all of the local lakes. Lake Comanche has been producing some good numbers, both from shore, and out on the boats. Shore fishing from North Shore day use area using crawlers and yellow power bait was working best. If you're trolling, North Shore between the big hat and little hat islands, using speedy shiners and fire red tiger stripe rapalas on the top. Most are catching limits within a few hours. Lake Comanche stocks, 3000 pounds weekly between North Shore South Shore and the pond. The pond is a great place to take your grandkids, easy accessibility. They are also catching one to 2 pound crappies off the dam at North Shore. They make for great fish tacos.

Lake Amador stocks weekly also, they're not putting in as many numbers but they're putting in some trophy sized large fish between five and 15 pounds. Lake Amador is fishing derby is still on until the end of March, 9 dollars to enter and there are 500 tagged fish with over \$5000 in prizes.

I Discovered a little lake outside Jackson called Lake Tabeaud, It's a day use area with nice hiking trails picnic area, a small lake that is stocked with trout by the California fish & game. Great place to take family or the grandkids. I see people leaving with stringers full of fish.

I'm taking some time off for the next couple months, so maybe my assistant can fill in with a fishing report, until then keep your lines tight and your pole bent.
