


BRUNO FEST 2025!!!

SIR Poker continues to be well attended. On February 10th we again had a full table of ten enthusiastic Texas Hold'em players, and as they say, a good time was had by all. Even those that didn't cash enjoyed the game, company, and snacks. We paid four winners in the first round, and because there were a couple of rebuys, we paid five players in the second round. Half the players cashed!

In the first round three players from Branch 149, **Paul Pyle, Rich Hanf and Don Krieger** placed first, second, and third. **Ron Critchley** took fourth, and Branch 65 avoided a sweep.

Branch 65 did a lot better in the second round, taking first, second, third and fourth places. **Richard Bennett** took first, **Ron second** (for a double win), **I** came in third, and **Jerry Stabile** took fourth. **Rich** was again in the money taking fifth place.

With ten players starting each hand, there was a lot of action and some big pots were won early in the two

sessions, even at the low starting betting limits. In our game, the betting limit goes up every 17 minutes. At the start of our session, the bet or raise amount during the last two betting rounds of each hand is 60 chips. When we start the fourth round after only 51 minutes of playing time, the last two betting rounds of each hand is 160 chips. Therefore, the pots are usually a lot larger later in the session. Winning a big pot early is a treat.



In the past I've talked about the importance of playing good sound opening cards. When there are a lot of players in the game, there may be occasions when you can loosen up a bit. One exception, if several players in front of you have called the pot, it may be worth your while to see a flop even with a marginal hand. Because of the many players in the hand, you may be getting pot odds that makes a so-so hand playable. If you get lucky and hit a good flop, you may win a big pot. If you don't hit the flop, fold, and play the next hand. Don't push your luck.

Our March second Monday poker session, will be on Feb.10th. If you would like to play Texas Hold'em with us, please give me or one of our players a call. The stake to play is a very small, \$10, but you get a lot of entertainment for your buck!

BR.65 CRUISERS.... Panama Canal Cruises January 5 – January 20 2025

Frances and I grabbed an opportunity to transit the Panama Canal this January. Our cruise began in Fort Lauderdale aboard the Island Princess cruise ship. This 'Panamax' ship was built to transit the older small locks of the Panama Canal.

From Fort Lauderdale we sailed to Cartegena, Colombia(R). This was an important port for the Spanish colonizers. There is a large colonial fort and a walled old town. Tourists spend most of their limited time in this area. Frances and I jumped aboard a Hop on Hop off bus that included a guided walking tour of this old section.(R) We visited a Catholic cathedral, an emerald shop and enjoyed lunch at a local restaurant where no one spoke English, the menu was in Spanish and the local beer was tasty and cold.

Next we transited the Panama Canal. There are three locks raising our ship to the man-made lake across which three locks lowered the ship to the Pacific Ocean level. Panama City is very modern. Of interest is that the French first attempted to construct the canal in 1881 but failed due to the difficult terrain and malaria/yellow fever which killed 20,000 workers. American ingenuity and rail tank cars loaded with DDT sprayed everywhere eventually saw the completion of the canal in 1914 after 10 years of construction.

Puntarenas, Costa Rica was our next stop. This is a very small port town with most of the excursions related to wild life and tropical forest trips. We saw a lot of crocodiles and over 40 species of birds during our excursion along the River Tarcoles. Needless to say, I did not dip my hand in the water over the side of the boat!

During our stop in Guatemala, we booked a ride to Antiqua which was the old Spanish capital. Again, wonderful preserved Spanish architecture, many shops, restaurants and churches. We had a wonderful lunch at Frida's restaurant! Guatemala has 37 volcanos with several active today.

Our last stop before Los Angeles was Puerto Vallarta Mexico. We strolled along the Malecon which is graced with many bronze statues. There was a pod of whales breeching about 100 yards shore. Of course, many shops, restaurants and bars plus another church.
