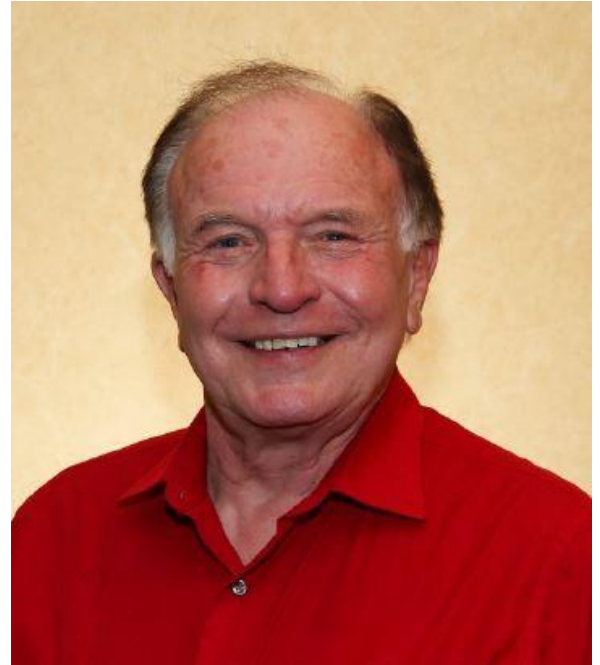

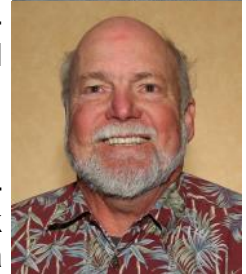
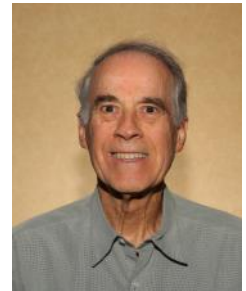


Hiking and Walking

SIR Kayakers had a great turnout and a beautiful day at Lake Del Valle on July 11th. We even gathered a non-member couple at the lake, a potential new member of SIR.

The NOAA forecast for the lake was sunny, with a high between 85 and 90 °F, with a westerly breeze of 5-11 mph. The breeze was at the lower end of that range, just enough to take the edge off the heat. We had a beautiful blue sky, with the hills their finest soft golden color.

We paddled first from the boat ramp up-stream toward the bridge. While the lake water was high, the stream has deposited gravel and sand as it enters the lake, making the water too shallow to go all the way to the bridge.

We turned towards the dam, and some of the group immediately saw a bald eagle heading in the same direction. In fact, some members saw a bald eagle a couple of weeks earlier at Del Valle swoop down and grab a fish starting from a distance of about a quarter of a mile away. It

was a very impressive example of great vision and precision.

On the way towards the dam we stopped along the way, enjoying the shade of a large oak tree. After lunch, a few returned to the boat ramp, while most of us continued to the dam before returning. Total time was about 4 hours, covering about 7-8 miles on the water.

The place of our next outing, the first Tuesday in August, is yet to be decided. Likely, we will go to Antioch and paddle to Big Break Regional Park on the Sacramento River, total distance about 10 miles round-trip. For those who do not yet have a kayak, some of us have more than one we are willing to lend. 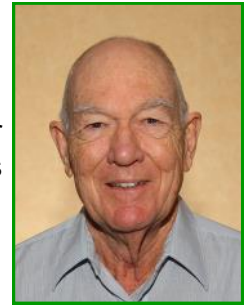

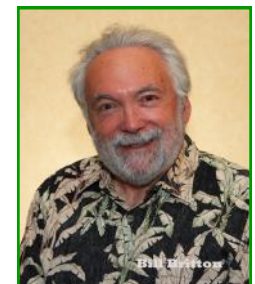

2023-24 SIR 101 Trips

Our Croatia & Its Islands trip this September 24-October 7 or extra day October 8 still has 3 cabins available in case you are looking for a great trip this fall. Availability depends on hotel and flights at this time. Let me know as soon as possible if you want to join us.

This is another trip I would certainly take if it did not conflict with the Croatia cruise. This is a special deal from Collette if you book through me and it is not a SIR sponsored trip and currently has limited availability. It is Cruising the Danube to the Black Sea from October 1 to October 13, 2023 or October 10 to October 23, 2023. Thanks to John Didlake for sharing this information at our May luncheon while I was away. This is a 2 for one deal for the cruise portion or 25% off if you want to go as a single. To get the deal you must book the air with Collette and is based on availability at this late a date. Pricing without air for 2 is \$5,799 lower outside, \$6,299 middle outside, \$7,299 upper outside, and \$9,799 for a suite. I highly recommend the travel insurance at \$599/person. Economy air from SFO was \$1,450 each back in May. You will need to act fast. Let me know soon if you

would like to take advantage of this special deal. Note these are the cruise-only prices. Air will depend on what is available and you must book air with Collette to get these prices. This is a change from when I first announced this in May.

Glenn Breslin at SIR 146 has a trip to Spain and Portugal April 27—May 12, 2024. He is also working with Collette on the 80th D-Day Trip to England and France in 2024. I mentioned this a couple of months ago at our SIR luncheon and a few people indicated interest.

Remember, if you want more information on any of these trips email me soon.

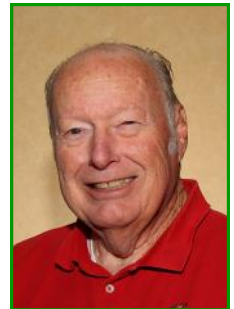

Avoid the long lunch line: RSVP the meeting invitation online, pre-pay your lunch via Zelle and arrive early to visit at the lunch.

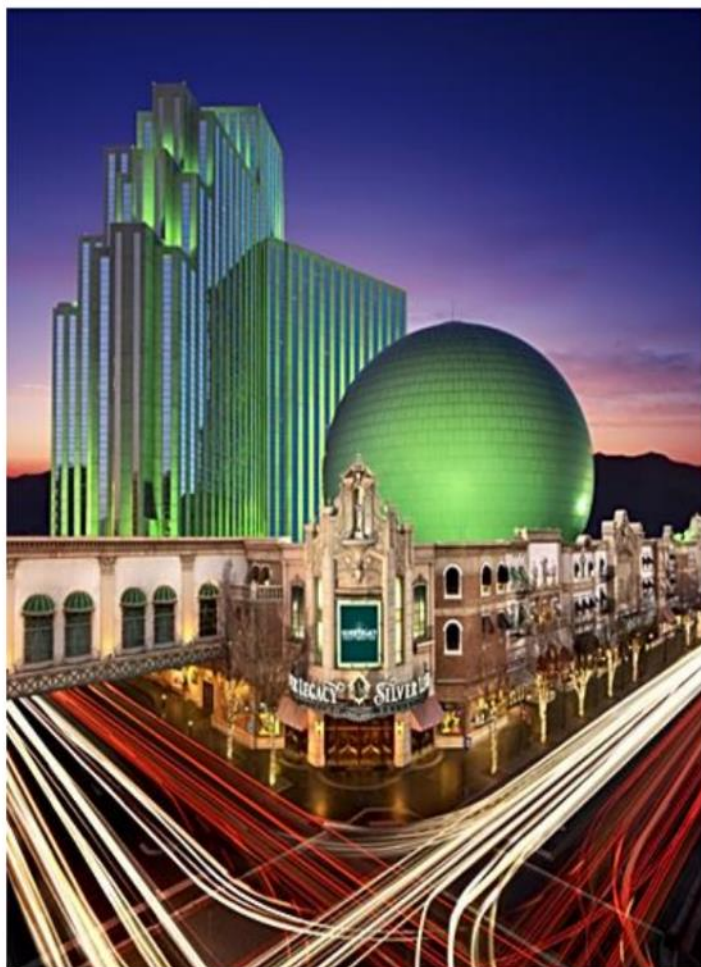
