The Big Sir Message from John Didlake

s I am sitting down to type my final Big Sir Newsletter article, I note that we are expecting over 100 for our Branch 101 Christmas Luncheon. I am looking forward to a great event with fun, food, fellowship, and a great musical program by the Devil Mountain Barbershop Chorus. However, I cannot help but reflect on where we began back in January as I took the position of Branch 101 Big Sir.

But first we cannot thank Rick Morrow and Dennis Gately enough as they navigated the Branch through probably the most difficult time that we have faced, that of COVID. I believe that Rick served tioning to a new bank with a lower minias Big Sir for two years and only hosted one in-person luncheon. We also need to thank Ted Schaefer, Little Sir 2022, for providing great speakers as we began to meet in-person again last year.

However, as I became Big Sir in January of 2023 the Branch was facing numerous challenges:

Our average attendance at our monthly luncheon was between 40 and 50. At \$35 per person we were losing between \$100 to \$300 on each luncheon, mainly because of the cost of the venue.

Our bank account had dipped below the required minimum balance and we were incurring a monthly bank service charge.

The luncheon venue was going to raise our cost per luncheon in February by \$125 and then another \$400 in June. This meant we were going to need to raise the price of the luncheon to \$45 or \$50 per person, which we expected to reduce the number of attendees. further exasperating the issue.

If that were not enough. Len Smith. our Newsletter editor and Webpage manager unexpectedly passed away in December.

Fortunately for me, I had a great set of Officers and Directors on our Branch



Executive Committee working behind the scenes to right the ship and keep us afloat. Thanks goes to Roger Grimm, our new treasurer, for finding and transimum balance for free checking. Thanks to Dennis Gately stepping up to be our Webpage Master and to Steve Skedzielewski for becoming Newsletter editor. All are doing great jobs.

I also need to thank our Activities Chairmen who were able to keep their activities going during the toughest of times or were able to restart activities in 2023. Big thanks to Art Hull who kept the Hiking Group going through COVID and to Dwight Lang for finding a way for Branch 101 Golfers to join other golfing groups this year after the golfing activity had collapsed in 2022.

Special thanks go to Roger Everett and Dick Crawford for finding and negotiating with Asbury United Methodist Church for use of their Fellowship Hall and at a lower cost than the previous venue. However, we needed to change our luncheons from the 4th Tuesday of each month to the 3rd Thursday. Also, we needed to increase our attendance at the luncheons to amortize the venue cost over more attendees to keep the

luncheon cost down. I thank all of you, our members, for 1) being flexible with the change of day for the luncheon, 2) going out and bringing back members who had not been attending the luncheons and 3) inviting guests that have become new members and regular attenders.

Out of tragedy came a Branch blessing; Lea, Len Smith's wife, asked that people make donations to SIR Branch 101 in Len's memory. We established a Len Smith Memorial Fund that we were able to use to reduce the cost of luncheons early in the year until we were able to raise the luncheon attendance. Thanks Lea and your family for your support of our Branch!

We had 70 members attend the November Luncheon and now have over 100 members, significant others,

and friends planning to attend the December Christmas Luncheon. We faced the challenges of 2023 together and have made it. Therefore, I view my year as Branch 101 Big Sir as a success, not from what I have done, but from what you all have done. It just goes to show, success is being in the right place at the right time and surrounding yourself with the right people.

One final analogy, I liken the Branch to one of the ducks that must swim like mad then while flapping its wings run on the surface of the water to take flight. We have finally taken flight. We did not sink. As I hand over the reins to Dwight Lang and Bob Johnson, I am confident that we will begin to soar again as we have in the past.

## **Our Planned Speakers :**.






Dom Saccullo shows us how to score four points. He rolled all four balls within 6 inches of the pallino. Awesome!

We had a very good turnout of 12 kayakers for our trip to Lodi Lake and the Mokelumne River. Lots of birds, flat, clear water, excellent weather, and great company made for a stellar day. All that, in spite of the NOAA weather forecast of "Patchy dense fog before 9 am. Otherwise, partly sunny, with a high near 66. Southeast wind 3 to 5 mph." There was no wind, only a touch of fog at the outset, and mild temperature, and blue sky. In other words, a perfect day to be on the water!

We traveled about 65 minutes and 58 miles to reach the Lodi Lake Park in the town of Lodi, where we put in at the boat launch ramp on the north side of the lake.

Having forgotten the route from the lake to the river, we took a bit of a detour and found the familiar river. On the north side of the river, it was either vineyards or forests. On the south side were nice "country cottages," in reality beautiful homes, large enough to be hotels. Not far away were homeless encampments that elsewhere could have been back-packers' camps. We paddled a bit more than three miles at a leisurely


pace to the Highway 99 bridge. Because of the noisy traffic, we turned around to a nice take-out spot we had been to a year before, a wide area of mowed grass under trees--perfect for our picnic. We had a sunny and warm time of lunch and conversation.

We returned to our launch spot, again at a liesurely pace, for a total time out of about 5 hours at 7.7 miles. Wild-life seen included some geese and a bunch of buzzards in a tree and flying over our heads. If you had been with us, you would have enjoyed a beautiful fall day on the water! Maybe next time – .

Our next outing location, normally scheduled for the first Tuesday in January, has not yet been decided, but likely will be closer to Livermore. If you don't (yet) have a kayak, some of us have extras that you can borrow. Just let me know, and it likely can be arranged. We tend to do easy trips, so little or even no experience is necessary! Try it – you will like it!
