




March, 2024

Nine SIR Kayakers had a perfect day on the water at Elkhorn Slough on Tuesday, March 5th. To begin, here's a bit of background.

The forecast in the days preceeding our First Tuesday outing was not ideal, holding pretty steady days in advance as "a 40 percent chance of rain. Partly sunny, with a high near 60 °F. SW winds 5 to 10 knots". In spite of the non-ideal conditions forecast, we decided to proceed as planned anyway, as it was somewhat better then a 50-50 chance there would be little or no rain. On Monday the forecast suddenly turned better, becoming "Partly sunny, with a high near 61. East southeast wind 6 to 8 mph becoming west southwest in the afternoon". There was no longer any mention of rain.

We arrived at Kirby Park up the slough from Moss Landing finding thin overcast grey sky with no wind. It remained pretty much that way for the remainder of the day, with patch of blue sky in the afternoon. It was perfect for our group, which included some paddlers with little or no recent paddling.

Six of us had a fine lunch in Moss Landing at Phil's Snack Shack, the other three having lunch on the beach. The previous favorite for lunch, Phil's Restaurant and Fish Market, with it's excellent claim chowder, is no more. The site is now under renovation as part of the Moss Landing Research Center.

The trip back go our launch spot at Kirby Park was a pleasant, uneventful paddle, with pelicans and other seabirds, harbor seals, and otters seen. The time since launch was about 4:30 hours.

A little environment note: We were told by a park ranger that there are now about 350 sea otters in the slough. They are offspring of a mating pair and others released by the Monterey Bay Aquarium after rehabilition. The otters are voracious eaters of burrowing crabs, said to be eating them as we eat popcorn! The crabs' burrowing destabilizes the slough banks, making them susceptible to tidal and heavy rainfall erosion.

The location of our next outing on the first Tuesday of April (the 2nd) has not been decided yet, but likely will be somewhere in San Francisco Bay. If you don't (yet) have a kayak and/or gear, some of us have extras to lend. Just let Dick Ryon <dickryon@comcast.net> or Doug Mansur <dmansurgm@gmail.com> know of your need, and likely it can be met.


