
We meet every Wednesday at the southeast corner of South L St. and Railroad Ave. and leave at 8:30 am for our hiking destination.








SIR 101 Kayaking

With the rain last Saturday, I looked up the weather forcast in the days preceding our scheduled kayak outing on May 7th to Sausalito and Richardson Bay. (We were last at Richardson Bay in January 2022, when we had a good turnout and fine weather.) This time, the forecast started a few days in advanced with NW wind 8 to 11 kt, with gusts as high as 18 kt. Sunny. In the next days, the gusts were dropped from the forecast, but otherwise remained pretty constant, so good news. When we arrived at our launch site on May 7th, we had clear blue sky and virtually no wind and flat water. Somebody said it was as calm as Lake Del Valle on a windless day. We paddled northward, passing under Highway 101, and continued to a nice park at the end of Richardson Bay, where we enjoyed warm weather, conversation, and lunch.

We contemplated going over to Belvedere Island, maybe as far as Tiberon, on the return trip, in order to increase the paddling distance a bit. However, a couple of people needed to return to Livermore fairly early, so we returned directly to the starting point. At Dunphy Park in Sausalito we completed our trip of about 6 miles in about 3.5 hours. It was another fine day on the water!

Our next paddling destination has not been decided yet, but it may be to Elkhorn Slough and Moss Landing. Humpback whales are being reported just outside the harbor entrance. The deep Monterey Canyon leads directly to the harbor entrance, which is the reason whales are seen close to shore. I once lead a group out of the harbor, where we must have seen a hundred whales. It may have been the same 10 seen over and over again, but as many as five spouts were seen at the same time! Those whales seem to be as curious about us as we are about them. A pod of whales followed us into the harbor entrance, emerging from the depths in the middle of our group, scattering us in all directions! Actually, except when feeding or simply leaping out of the water, they seem exquisitly aware of their own size and location of their bodies, and avoid contact with us little folk on the surface.

Our usual scheduled trips are the first Tuesday of each month. If you don't yet have a kayak and would like to join us, some of us have extras boats to lend. Just let me know, and likely it can be arranged.


