have to say, I really appreciate nice evenings that we typically have here in Livermore during the summer. I'm sitting outside enjoying the weather, as I hope you are, and hoping that we won't get into the serious hot weather for a while.

At this point you all should have received your invitation for our annual SIRs Picnic on June 20th, it should be a lot of fun. We have already received RSVPs for 47 people who will be attending, so don't wait (see the note below if you'll pay by check).

We will have BBQ chicken, St. Louis pork ribs, a vegetarian entrée for those that order one, corn on the cob, chili beans, spinach and berry, garlic bread, great desserts and drinks. Live music will be performed by Tim Gomes and we'll have some fun games, including a trivia game and a bingo game with prizes! Wives and significant others are invited as well, so sign up now! You will enjoy it!

And now, more good news, I want to confirm the report from our treasurer that we will not need to raise the cost of our luncheons this year. As I mentioned in the March bulletin, the cost of providing the substantial meal at our luncheons has gone up by \$1.50, from \$22 to \$23.50 per meal. The increased attendance at the luncheons and the very good re-

sponse from members paying their annual dues (89%), allows us to cover the additional costs. Thank you! (But if you haven't paid your dues yet for 2024, please do so)



The May speaker at the General Meeting was Herbert Cole, Livermore's Emergency Manager, and he gave us a briefing on the City's efforts to prevent and mitigate both community and personal harm from serious events such as flooding and earthquakes. It was reassuring to hear that California is one of the best states in the nation as far as emergency preparation. This was spurred by the realization in the 80's the many counties and cities did not have compatible communication or even firefighting plumbing systems to provide help to each other. The key emergency steps are: mitigation, meaning pre-event preparation to lessen the impact of an event, response to the event, and recovery, which will always take longer than people expect. Cities are on their own and cannot expect help from County nor from State ("all disasters are local"). By the work done here, Livermore may become the first city

in the state to be accredited by non-profit Emergency Management Accreditation Program. He gave out very useful pamphlets on how to prepare for these types of serious events. There will be no speaker at the picnic, but the talks will resume in July. The July speaker will be Terri Molano, Executive Director of Partners In Change Tri-Valley, an organization that helps distressed people better manage their finances.



SIR Kayakers to Elkhorn Slough Trip Report

We had a rather good turnout for our kayak trip at Elkhorn Slough on June 4th, with ten people. The original plan was to go out to sea from Moss Landing Harbor to look for whales. The whale-watch boats have reported seeing many humpbacks, a couple or orcas, and lots of Risso's dolphins, which are "mini-whales" about 15 feet long, with a large dorsal fin sticking out of the water as they swim.

However, plans changed a bit when wind gusts of 18 knots were forecast off the coast. White-caps appear at about 15 knot wind. With some of our kayakers being relative novices, we decided to break into two groups, with Kim Grandfield leading a group, as we originally planned, out to sea from Moss Landing seeking whales. Dick Ryon lead a group within Elkhorn Slough, between a place called Kirby Park to Moss Landing. People could choose which group to go with. It turns out that seven people decided to launch at Kirby Park, and only three doing the original plan. To our surprise, those who sought whales saw none. They went about 1.5 miles off-shore along the deep Monterey Canyon, before returning to Moss Landing, where they met up with the slough kayakers just beyond the Hwy 1 bridge at a nice, sandy beach for lunch. The slough kayakers had a leisurely paddle, with just a gentle breeze in their faces on the way to Moss Landing. After lunch, both groups went up the slough about half-way to Kirby Park together, then returning to their two launch sites.

We saw several sea otters in the water, as well as harbor seals sleeping on the shore. There were lots of pelicans, some hitting the water to catch fish. There were also large flocks of smallish birds, guessing maybe terns, flying overhead.

So, all-in-all, another fine day on the water! If you wish to join us, but don't (yet) have a kayak, some of us have extra boats and gear that we would gladly share. Contact either Doug Mansur or Dick Ryon. Our usual date is the first Tuesday of the month, July 2nd next time. The place has not been decided yet, but we're thinking about Drakes Estero in Point Reyes.
