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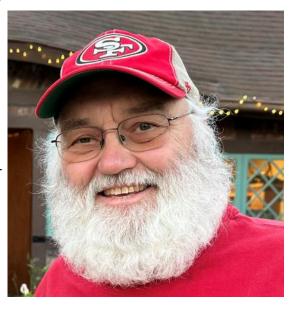
The Big Sir Message from Bob Johnson

Speaker: Kim Grandfield

Topic: Kayak Circumnavigation of Norway's Lofoten Islands

Kim Grandfield holds a degree in nuclear engineering from Kansas State University. He left a five-year career with General Electric in 1975 to pursue his outdoor passions and start Sunrise Mountain Sports in downtown Livermore. During his tenure operating his store Kim taught outdoor skills classes for LARPD including a mountaineering and crevasse rescue class on Mount Shasta for 23 years and igloo building in the Sierra for more than 30. He is certified at the highest level as a sea kayak instructor in the American Canoe Association and also attained the highest level of sea kayaking certification in the British Canoe Union. For nine years he operated a concession on Lake Del Valle, renting kayaks and teaching kayaking for East Bay Regional Park District. After 42 years, Kim retired from his outdoor store in 2017. Over the years Kim has participated in rock climbing, mountaineering, back

country skiing and kayak expeditions around the world including Greenland and Antarctica.

Kim's 2024 kayaking expedition

was a 14 day, 208 mile journey in Northern Norway with 2 fellow kayakers. About 200 miles north of the Arctic Circle along Norway's coast lies a rugged chain of islands, the Lofoten Islands, which protrude into the Atlantic Ocean like a peninsula. By all appearances it is a spectacular mountain range about half submerged in the north Atlantic with little flat ground anywhere in sight. At the January SIR meeting Kim will be presenting images and highlights from his 2024 Lofoten Kayak Expedition.

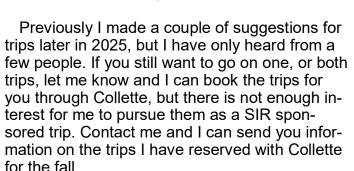

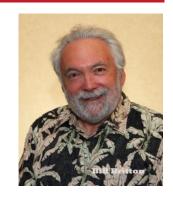
Happy New Year and Happy Travels
