[•]he month of May reminds me of how our family spent Memorial Day when I was growing up in Central Illinois. Perhaps you had a similar experience. As you may know, what became Memorial Day began as Decoration Day in 1868 to honor Union soldiers who died in the Civil War. It was later changed to Memorial Day to honor all U.S. military personnel. At some point it evolved to also include remembering all deceased family members. That is how it was with my family when I was growing up and the tradition has continued. Along with the American flags placed on the graves of veterans by the scouts, graves of family members are adorned with flowers.

Today the flowers are plastic and cemetery rules usually require that placement of the flowers will not obstruct mowing. When I was a kid the flowers we placed were fresh cut, mostly peonies grown in our yard and that of my paternal grandmother. We started the day by cutting the peonies and arranging them in glass jars, usually mayonnaise or peanut butter jars with the labels removed, and water added. A Mason canning jar might be added if needed.

The first stop was the cemetery in town where my Dad's side of the family was buried. A jar with flowers was placed on each grave of a relative. The next stop was 10 miles east





of town to the country cemetery where my mom's relatives were buried. My great-great grandfather donated the land and started the cemetery when a hired man working for him died. After that we visited another cemetery an additional 10 miles to the east where more of my mother's relatives were buried. I particularly remember at each stop watching the flags on the graves of veterans fluttering in the warm spring breeze.

As a kid, Memorial Day also meant that school would be getting out soon and I was looking forward to summer. Speaking of summer, mark your calendar now for our annual picnic on June 19.
