## **BIG SIR COMMENTS:** Gabe Reddig

" "Hi folks! Today I will tell you the tale of the new knee for me. I know that there are many of you, maybe only a few, who want to know how my total right

knee replacement surgery worked out, as you can see some similar surgery in your future. I can report to you that it happened as scheduled at Sutter Hospital Roseville on Monday the 15th of May. I checked into Surgery at 7:30 AM, went through the preop & registration process, and was in surgery from 9:30 to 11:00. Next it was on to Recovery for 3 & 1/2 hours, and then the Lovely "Dot" had me home by 2:30 with my completely new bionic knee joint, feelin' no pain & experiencing only joy that this long anticipated surgery was completed - successfully!!! They get you up walking as soon as the anesthesia wears off, and the beautiful 72 hour pain shots they give directly to the knee before surgery makes movement with a walker a "piece of cake". There is a good deal of swelling right at the knee, and at the thigh and ankle area, but the pain killer meds mask the effects perfect-

And you guessed it, this easy transition could not be possible without the magic of "Pharmaceuticals"! The important ones are - Oxy & acetaminophen (Percocet), Ibuprofen, and Colace - a vital laxative & stool softner. The good pain killers back ya up real good, so it must be proactively managed. Now it's Wednesday night/Thursday morning & the 72 hour pain shots in the knee are wearing off......It's not a great feeling - gotta reach for the good stuff and start managing the pain & swelling. I am very lucky as my Medicare and TRICARE insurance plans allow for a home healthcare nurse visit twice a week, and a physical therapist visit twice a week also for up to three weeks after the surgery. Believe me, get it if you can because the nurse and the physical therapist are really indispensable. It's Friday after lunch as I write this, and I just got some good news! The physical therapist has just finished, after her second visit this week, and left me with a very nice thought. She says my ability to stretch the knee is going way better & faster than expected, and my bend/stretch angle is about 115 degrees, and typically is in the 75 - 80 degrees range 5 days after surgery. I told here "thanks very much," and that I finally now have a topic for my Big SIR Comments! We got this, Gabe Reddig, guys! We can do it!!!"
