

.We will start having SIR 102 Golf Club (GC) rounds this month. To keep 102 GC playing each week we will need to follow the State SIR Activities Guidelines, the golf courses' protocol, and finally the GC's procedures at the golf course. Each of them will be attached to the email with the monthly signup sheet. In the future they will also be on our website when you click on the monthly signup sheet window.

When the 2020 Golf season was suspended by State SIR, your GC board decided to extend the 2020 Club Championship and Match Play into 2021. The 5th and last Club Championship round will be played at Alister MacKenzie on the 18th. Three Match Play flight champions have been decided and as soon as the other flight champion has been decided, the two round Flight Championship matches will decide the 2020 Match Play Champion. 2021 Match Play signups will begin in April. Unlike the WGC's Match Play Championship format scheduled for 24-28 March, we have double elimination in the four flights and then a two round Championship round. The 2021 Club Championship is played over 5 months. One course per month will be designated as the Club Championship round. There are four flights and the winner of each flight will be the member that has the lowest total net of his 3 best (low net) rounds.

I've noticed that there has been a noticeable drop in the number of members playing when we have scrambles. There are two reasons for the scrambles. The first reason is some courses by their layout are harder and more important take longer to play i.e. Woodcreek's 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 6th, 10th, and 11th holes. The second reason is it's a way for members to meet, to mingle with each other. This was particularly true when we had 149 - 165 members in the GC and we had straight normal tee times, no shotgun starts. With the GC membership hovering around a little over 100 members and the same 24-32 members playing each scramble, and the same 16 - 27 members skipping the scrambles , it may be time to change the format. Scrambles are great for the 2 overnight and Carson City trips (sometime in the future).

I need to buy some pails; they are on my bucket list.

I graduated college in 1969 and was married one month later. I was about to get drafted into the Army. I was having trouble finding a job as employers felt I would not be able to work for more than a couple of months. My wife got pregnant. So,.. I really needed a job. GMAC (the old lending agency for General Motors) hired me for training and being job ready

when I returned from the service. MY JOB: <u>track down customers who were on the run from paying for their new cars!!</u> I would get assignments each day to locate and track down these people and when I did it ... I was to repossess the cars. I was pretty much on my own! The job was somewhat dangerous. I traveled backroads in small towns looking for these customers. I had every response from crying, to pulling a gun on me, to trying start fights with me!

I was drafted into the Army but my wife ended up with pregnancy complications that put her in the hospital. The Army gave me a six months "furlough" time to take care of my wife. I never heard from them again and never was called back for service. I left the job with GMAC a few years later. I ended up with a middle management position and it never came close to the excitement of that first "training" job. I spent most of my working career as a teacher in the Elk Grove School District. At the time I was doing my work for GMAC it was a kinder and gentler country. I cannot image doing a job like that in today's society.

Dan Maglionico: AN ENGINEERING ENVIRONMENTALIST AHEAD OF HIS TIME!

Originally from Cleveland Ohio. Graduated from Akron University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering. Worked for Consulting engineering firm in Akron <u>designing highway bridges</u> during school and after graduation. To avoid being drafted in Army went to Naval Officer Candidate School in Newport Rhode Island and was commissioned an Ensign in the <u>Navy Civil Engineering Corps</u>. Attended Naval Civil Engineering School in

Port Hueneme, met Dorothy and we were sent to Naval Air Station in Patuxent River MD where I served as Assistant Resident Officer in Charge of Construction, aka AROINC, I was in charge of contract administration and inspection of construction of the civilian contractors working on the base. Decided that the Military life was not for us and went back to my previous consulting engineering job in Akron Ohio working on highway design, sewer construction inspection and became project manager of civil engineering and construction for waste to energy plant owned by Hooker Chemical Co in Niagara Falls NY. Plant was built to burn household garbage to fuel boilers and create steam to be used by Hooker. Used VA benefits to get private pilot license instrument rating to fly from Akron to Niagara Falls. Did not like winter in Akron and landed job with consulting firm in Palo Alto, CA with branch office in Sacramento to be project manager for waste to energy facility in Richmond, CA. Moved to Folsom. Due to environmental concerns the project did not get past the Environmental Impact report. Became Vice President in charge of energy and landfill projects. Left company in 1985 and became private consultant working for various hauling and landfill operators in CA. Also obtained a Building inspection franchise from national franchisor. Did inspections of homes, commercial buildings and shopping centers. Worked on various landfill designs, and recycling reports for various counties in CA. Became owner's representative to oversee contracts and construction for Solid Waste transfer station and recycling facilities in Tracy and South San Francisco, CA. Wife strongly suggested retirement after heart attack and bypass surgery in 2003. Moved to El Dorado Hills three years ago and busy now playing golf, fishing, Pinochle, Scrabble, Hand and Foot Canasta and SIR. Been happily married for 50 years to same lovely wife.

The Berlin Wall did not come down until 1989 so we drove through the East Berlin corridor to West Berlin to attend this event which was quite an experience.

Jay Verhaag: DEPLOYING OUR FIRST "STAR WARS" SYSTEMS

I spent 2 1/2 years on Kwajalein in The Marshall Islands in the early sixties with then Douglas Aircraft, now part of Boeing. I was a young guy, just out of the US Air Force (non flyer) when I went to work. I apparently did well because I was selected to go to the Kwaj. Field station as Operations Guy. (All things having to do with personnel, travel, payroll, security, etc.). The mission...launch the FIRST ever missile to intercept an incoming ICBM; i.e. hitting a "bullet with a bullet". The beginning of what was later called "Star Wars"! We did it with a Douglas missile called the Nike Zeus. I witnessed the world's first live intercepts of an incoming ICBM; later a salvo firing intercepting more than one missile. Pretty incredible stuff, especially if you consider the technology of the 60's compared to today! This was the beginning of today's US deployed systems. These were heady times for a young 25/26 year old!
