#### MESSAGE FROM OUR TRAVEL CHAIRMAN BILL MAFFEI

#### Fellow SIR Travelers:

This is a great time of the year to visit the Sierra Foothill communities. The autumn season usually has wonderful weather, and the foothill areas are very welcoming to visitors. The areas I am going to focus on this month are the twin Nevada County cities of Grass Valley and Nevada City. The time frame is this December. Both Grass Valley and Nevada City have Christmas/winter programs.

Nevada City sponsors the Nevada City Victorian Christmas. The main streets of this small town are lit up and decorated with Christmas lighting. Carolers stroll the streets and fill the area with seasonal music. Merchants and local eateries have seasonal winter delights. The bakeries have pastries and gingerbread cookies for sale. Santa visits from the North Pole. It is a step back into the Victorian era, complete with old-fashioned gas lamps in the dimly lit streets and locals dressed in Victorian costumes. Local artisans have their crafts on display and for sale. This is truly a step back in time.

This event takes place on the following Wednesdays, December 10th and 17th; and, on the following Sundays, December 7th, 14th and 21st. The town comes alive at 6:00 p.m. and runs to about 9:30 p.m.

Grass Valley has a traditional Cornish Christmas. This event is held on Friday evenings starting at 6:00 p.m. and going to approximately 9:30 p.m. This starts the Friday after Thanksgiving and ends on Friday, December 19th. This takes place in downtown Grass Valley on Main Street and Mill Street. Again, we have holiday music from local carolers. Artisans have their crafts for sale. The area restaurants will feature holiday cuisine. The merchants will remain open during the entire festival. Grass Valley has a free shuttle service with pickups at the Fairgrounds, Pine Creek Shopping center, McKnight Crossing Shopping Center to the event on Main and Mill Streets. The shuttle service starts at 6:00 p.m. and the last shuttle leaves at 8:00 p.m. The shuttle may take approximately thirty minutes. This is the first year for the shuttle service

Visiting one or both events is a great way to start the Christmas season. The weather should be cold, sooo dress appropriately (golf shorts nor short-sleeved golf shirts not recommended). Snow quite possibly could be on the ground! It could rain. Dress in layers, bring gloves, a hat and a scarf. Don't let the weather dampen your spirits. My wife and I went to these events and thoroughly enjoyed ourselves. Of course, we dressed appropriately.

Have a great Thanksgiving. And when I am not hitting a slice or shank on the golf course, I hope to see you down the road.
