Time is flying by and things are really getting complicated in Branch 102 and the rest of the world. Inflation's going up and baby food is going down, and

In case you don't know it, the website, SIR102.com is now gone and we have moved to *sirinc2.org/branc102/*. In the process we are saving several hundreds of dollars a year and the new site is truly very similar to the old site. Unfortunately, we did not get everything transferred over to the new site, primarily because I did not know how to make all the changes. Fortunately, Kevin King, the Webmaster from another branch, helped us, Norm Stienbach, Jim Stephenson, and Tom Mckinley, by moving a lot of our "stuff" over and giving us enough knowledge to get the Home page, the Golf Page, the Pictures moved over. It's a very timely process and even though WordPress provides a lot of information to make it work, the information is difficult for an 80-year-old. We will get there, guaranteed. We will also, hopefully, get either SIR102.com or SIR102.org for our website.

For your information, as I discussed in our last Newsletter, the Branch fund is slowly diminishing, and we need to make sure that all the costs are covered before we run out of money to pay our way. As I said before, most Branches are paying at least \$25 to \$30 for lunch and \$40 for dues. We are also considering asking those who do not eat at the luncheon to pay a small fee for some of the additional costs we have for the Luncheon beyond the food itself. We have received information from Elks Lodge on the total breakdown of their costs and it includes the following estimate and our additional costs:

> Setup - \$150.00 Linen - 1.25 Bar - 125.00 Rent - 200.00 Food - 636.00 for 53 members at \$12 each $\begin{array}{r} \text{Total} = 050.00 \text{ K} \\ \text{Tips} = 64.00 \\ \text{Total} = $1240.00 \end{array}$

According to our treasurer we took in \$1022.00 and this does include the speakers lunch, guests, and the wine raffle which is roughly \$70.00 on average. So we are looking at approximately #100.00 to \$200 short of our costs every Month. In addition to this shortfall, if you will, we also have additional costs related to
