The highlight was the medallion presentation led by guest presenters Retired Chief Master Sergeant Jim Sullivan and Retired Master Sergeant Michael Grabow, both with the Non-Commissioned Officers Association (NCOA) Medallions were bestowed on numerous SIR 102 honorees – all veterans from the Army, Navy, Marines and Air Force. Perhaps another highlight was listening to each service group sing their particular service songs (some perhaps slightly off key).

In his remarks, Scott noted that – while he never served on active duty – he comes from a family with a strong military tradition: Scott's father was an Army helicopter pilot (with 28 years of service) including WWII, Korea, plus 3 tours to Vietnam. SOME NOTABLE OCTOBER HISTORICAL EVENTS

October 1, 1908 - Henry Ford's Model T, a "universal car" designed for the masses, went on sale for the first time.

October 3, 1863 - President Abraham Lincoln issued a <u>proclamation</u> designating the last Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day. (Always one of my favorite holidays)

October 13, 1775 - The United States Navy was born after the Second Continental Congress authorized the acquisition of a fleet of ships.

October 19, 1781 - As their band played *The World Turned Upside Down*, the British Army marched out in formation and surrendered to the Americans at Yorktown. More than 7,000 British and Hessian troops, led by British General Lord Cornwallis, surrendered to General George Washington. The war between Britain and its American colonies was effectively ended. The final peace treaty was signed in Paris on September 3, 1783.

October 26, 1881 - The shoot-out at the O.K. Corral in Tombstone, Arizona, occurred between the feuding Clanton and Earp families. Wyatt Earp, two of his brothers and "Doc" Holliday gunned down two Clantons and two others.

October 28, 1919 - Prohibition began in the U.S. with the passage of the National Prohibition (Volstead) Act by Congress. Sales of drinks containing more than one half of one percent of alcohol became illegal. Called a "noble experiment" by Herbert Hoover, prohibition last nearly 14 years and became highly profitable for organized crime which manufactured and sold liquor in saloons called speakeasies. (Wonder what they were thinking to do that)

October 31, 1941 - Mount Rushmore National Memorial was completed after 14 years of work. The memorial contains 60-foot-tall sculptures of the heads of Presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt - representing America's founding, political philosophy, preservation, and expansion and conservation.
