Once again, the cost of the food is only \$12.00, not \$25.00, there are additional costs, and the facilities at Elks provides us with everything we need very, very comfortably. As Big Sir, which will end in another Month, I feel we should stay at Elks and try and work out anything that we feel needs to be improved. How many members would we lose if we relocated? All the current BEC members agree that we should continue at our current location. Anyone who feels we should make a change should volunteer for a BEC position and make suggestions for moving to a new facility. That's what it takes to make changes in any organization. I realize I'm on the wrong side of some our members but that's my opinion. To make one final comment on this issue, my primary interest in SIR 102 is getting together with friends, playing golf, and enjoying what time I have left in this world, not debating where and what we eat.
