Ted Bracht showed up for Thursday golf decked out in a blue fleece vest and matching hat, complete with matching Yankee logos. "I grew up in the Bronx a mile from Yankee Stadium. We used to sneak in all the time and watch the games for free. We'd go in through the Player's entrance, and up the stairs. The Yankees didn't seem to mind too much. They used the kids as a marketing ploy.

My Dad was a diesel mechanic at the Brooklyn Navy Yard. He liked to go over to the Polo Grounds and watch the Giants. When they left for California, I was heart broken. I hated the Giants until 2010, when they won the World Series.

After one year of college, I decided that it was not for me and went into the Air Force. I served from 1966-1970. I was a missile implementation tech at Vandenberg, part of a team which attached two packages to the Minute Man Missile, one, a self-destruct package. I was going to work for Boeing in the Minuteman 2-3 Program, however, Boeing eliminated the program. I worked for Ford Aeronautics for a year and a half and went to Greenland tracking satellites. One interesting thing was carrying on a long distance relationship with my girl friend in California. We tapped into a company in Mountain View and were able to make free phone calls from Greenland. Ford lost the contract and I decided to go to school.

I went to Arizona State, got a B.A. in accounting and went to work for Earnst & Earnst, on an audit team for 10 years out of their San Jose office. One of our clients owned an Ohio newspaper, the Toledo Blade, which had an affiliate in Monterey. We would always schedule the audit around the time of the Crosby Clambake, later known as the AT@T championships. We would get press passes and got quite an eyeful. I worked for Gallo for 10 years, and then worked for Max Foster at Foster Farms for 17 years as the Controller of Foster Farm for all the dairies. I retired in 2013 to take care of my wife, Linda. We were married for 41 years and had one daughter, and four grandchildren ages 5-12. Linda died in 2013.

In 2019, I married my current wife, Sheryl. We moved to Oakdale in 2021. I like to play golf, complain about golf, and read mysteries. I sing in the choir at Centenary Methodist, attend a weekly men's Bible study, and like old hymns with great lyrics. I enjoy Sir. It gives me a structure for golf and I like the social aspect."
