SIR Publication Information

SONS IN RETIREMENT (SIR) is a social organization for men. The organization is designed to be a luncheon club composed of men no longer involved in full-time occupations. The purpose of SIR is to promote the well being of men through association of other men interested in increasing their quality of life through developing new friendships, and through activities with physical and mental social involvement.

SIR branches sponsor a variety of activities and the Chico Branch 110 has an active "History Group" which involves exploring topics related to Chico's historic buildings, institutions, businesses and people. Besides enjoying monthly meetings with discussions of topics of interest and some more formal presentations, some members are involved in pursuing original research on topics of historic interest in Chico.

These research projects are driven by individual's curiosity and often result in a significant amount of information which seems worthy of sharing. Besides the desire to share the information, there is often a strong desire/goal of the preservation of this historical information for other interested people.

These desires often lead to consideration of publishing the results of the research. Various options are available but the idea of having a publication crediting the SIR organization with the origin of the efforts leading to publications seemed attractive.



Historical Notes

Introduction: Shearer Park was a very important part of life in Chico from 1908 to 1922 as the site for baseball games, circus performances among other activities. It was fondly remembered by the many who use to frequent the area in those days. However, it is currently no longer a memory and currently people do not even have an awareness of its existence. This is an endeavor to attempt to preserve a bit of some old Chico history.

Salem Street

1907: Plans to Join the Trolley League

While several people were initially opposed to joining, it was published that "The principal drawback to the baseball project is the lack of grounds provided, and to date no suitable solution has been found".

3-1-1908: Delay to join the Trolley League

Chico Record, Number 51, 1 March 1908.

1908: Trolley League Formation

Despite indications that Chico was not prepared to join the Trolley League, as of March 1, somehow Shearer Park was developed as a baseball field, a team had been organized and the Sacramento Valley Trolley League had been formed with Chico, Gridley, Marysville, and Oroville as the original teams.

1913: Proposal for extension of Salem St.


Hearing on Salem Street extension is set. Supervisors to hear claims of both sides on January 8. 1913. Chico Record, Number 285, 6 December 1912.

Supervisors voted to extend Salem Street through Shearer Park essentially cutting the property in half.
Sacramento Daily Union, Vol. 169, Number 11, 11 January 1913

It has not been determined exactly when the Salem Street extension occurred; but plans were pursued to play baseball.

1914: Chico Colts played at Shearer Park

Despite an initial belief that it would not be possible to play there because of decreased area, it was decided to continue to use it for baseball. A new grandstand was immediately built at the south west corner of what would become 11th Street and Salem As shown below. The diamond was leveled for early spring practice.

1920: Roundup held at Shearer Park

1921: The Barber baseball team played

Oroville at Shearer Park


5-4-1922: Grandstand at Shearer Park declared unsafe.

Is Declared Fire Hazard.


Fire Chief Tovee, after inspecting the high school and Shearer Park bleachers, declared them unsafe. The Shearer property is for lease to anyone who will attempt the repair of the bleachers, so that they will comply with the law.
