MERRY JANUARY 6TH

Early Christians celebrated Christmas on Jan. 6 until the Roman Empire moved the holiday to Dec. 25 in the 336 A.D. during the reign of Emperor Constantine. The late December date took the place of pagan holidays celebrating Roman gods and the Winter Solstice.

Jan 6. continued to be celebrated as Christmas by Britons and other Europeans in the Julian calendar. The changeover to the Gregorian calendar in 1582 moved Christmas to Dec. 25 and closer to the Winter Solstice. It was adopted by the British and Irish in 1752 which helped bring the calendar change to the American colonies. Other European countries, including Russia and its Eastern European neighbors, did not switch over until the early 20th Century. Orthodox Christians still celebrate Christmas on Jan. 7.

Still, Jan. 6 holds a place in Christmas celebrations for Armenians, the Irish as well as folks in Appalachia and some Christian believers such as the Amish and Mennonites. Armenians — who are among the earliest in the Christian faith — still celebrate Christmas on Jan. 6. In Ireland, the Jan. 6 celebrations have included women getting together for their own holiday festivities and the men of their households handling the cooking, cleaning and other chores for a day.

In Appalachia, Old Christmas still has a place for some with traditions such as getting together with family and friends, putting candles in windows and holiday food such as versions of fruitcakes (including apple stack cake), mincemeat pies and Christmas hams and serenading friends and neighbor

But Jan. 6 is actually the end of traditional 12 Days of Christmas celebrations. The 12 days marks the birth of Jesus (Dec. 25) through the Coming of the Magi (the Three Wise Men).
