NASCAR/INDY CAR Report by Barrie Lee



7/2/23

July 2nd 2023 made history. For the first time in the 75 year history of NASCAR, they completed a road race in a major American city, Chicago, IL. With record rain pelting the circuit both on Saturday and Sunday, Nascar pulled off a great racing event. The 2.2 mile circuit was scheduled for 100 laps, but since they started the race late, they cut the number of laps down to 75 due to lack of available sunlight. Since the start of Nascar, only six drivers won an inaugural event. One year, 1951, Martin Burke won at the Oakland Speedway which my father maintained for many years. A New Zealander won the race for Trackhouse Racing's 91 project. Justin Marks, the team owner had created this project and to bring in road race experts from different series to compete. He started this last year with Kimi Raikkonen (Formula One Champion) doing the chore. This year he picked a sedan racer from down under that has won 80 events in his series. Scott McLaughlin, who currently drives for Team Penske in IndyCar, is also a product of that sedan series. So the top ten results are as follows;

As you might be aware, NBC is now covering Nascar for the second half of their season. Fox does a good job with their coverage, but NBC removed their racing channel and now charge you to watch "Peacock" which is a pay to watch channel whenever they don't carry a race on their main network. David Malukas was 6th for Dale Coyne Racing with HMO Motorsports. Seventh place went to Graham Rahal (15) with his family's team. Pato O'Ward (5) was 8th in the Arrow McLaren, Marcus Armstrong (11) was 9th for Chip Ganassi, and Alexander Rossi (7) made the top ten for Arrow McLaren. GREAT Racing. By the way Graham Rahal made the front row in qualifying and his teammate did well also (Lundgaard) in 4th. It's been a long time for Rahal to start up front and finish well. Maybe, just maybe it's because their team calls Ohio home and their home track is Mid Ohio.

His two teammates join him today with Scott McLaughlin 2nd and Josef Newgarden 3rd. Saturdays race was won by Josef Newgarden (#2) and Scott McLaughlin 2nd (#3) Pato O'Ward was third driving for the Arrow Team McLaren (#5), Marcus Ericsson was 4th (#8) was 4th and Will Power (#12) rounded out the top five. Great race but no one could touch Josef.

7/23/23

Will Power again was on pole with Scott McLaughlin 2nd. I believe Josef started from 6th place on the grid.
