

The Pres Sez'



I hope this finds everyone doing well and settling into the heat of a Redding Summer...man that was a short spring. The June temps saw high 90's and low 100's real quick. It's been a busy month for me. Considerable time spent preparing for a Town Hall meeting that State Sir was holding for the branches. The focus of this meeting was to bring the branch's information on where the State believes the organization should head in the coming months in order to become a sustainable and viable asset to our communities. I briefed the BEC on some of the changes being proposed and they were all invited to the Town Hall meeting. Later in this newsletter I'll include a segment on the immediate areas to focus as well as some long term suggestions. The hope is to be transparent with the branches up front to avoid the issue of years past which eroded the trust that Branch Leaders may have had with the State Board. Why are we doing this? It's really very simple. I believe I've made clear to all of you how important this organization is to our community. That being a group focused on improving the quality of life for our members by encouraging an active and vibrant lifestyle. To exercise both your mind and your body to improve your health and hence prolong the time you have with family and friends. When SIR was formed in the late 1950's the predominant activity for the members was to come together and play golf. Over time other activities were added and branches expanded throughout the state from Fresno north as far as Mt Shasta. Membership reached a peak of around 30,000 members and 179 branches. But in the later part of the 90's and upon entering the...(Continued on next page)

...21st Century we started seeing our membership dwindle and the closure of branches. Several branches merged with others to the point we are today with right around 8400 members and 84 branches. As far back as 2004 the State started looking into what was needed to change the direction and get back to having a presence in our communities like it had been years before. However, due to a variety of reasons, no action was ever taken with the support of all (or most) of the branches. A little over a year ago the incoming 2024 State President (then the VP) set about collecting a team of individuals that came together to take a more focused approach to change and after many Zoom calls, phone calls, a couple of face to face meetings, including one where all branch leadership was invited to attend and participate, we set upon a series of proposals geared towards bringing the organization out of the 50's/60's and into the world of today. The last 6 months I have been the Acting President and responsible for shepherding the team to stay on track and this month I presented our proposed changes to branch leaders via that previously mentioned Town Hall meeting. I believe there is a light at the end of the tunnel and a positive change in direction for the organization is on the horizon. We are not close to being done as each of the changes will require considerable effort to implement. But with participation of branches in the solutions and a little bit of patience and persistence we can become a much more visible organization within our communities and that should lead to an increase in membership, more types of activities added to branch calendars, and more lives positively impacted through embracing a lifestyle that promotes participation in activities geared towards enriching one's life.

Since IndyCar is running the streets of Detroit, MI tomorrow, the IMSA Endurance Series is running today. The top class runs Cadillac, Acura, Astin Martin, Porsche, etc. I watched and enjoyed a good race with Acura taking the win.

6/2/24

The IndyCar series is running the Detroit street course today and it is a tight fit when you're running over 180 mph with 27 cars. Team Penske had its problems today with only Will Power finishing in 6th place. So today, Chip Ganassi Racing returned to win the race with Scott Dixon and Armstrong in the #11 Dalara in 3rd. Andretti Global finished 2nd with Ericsson in the #28 and Kirkwood finished 4th in the #27. Good showing after some fairly poor performances so far this year. Ericsson won the Indy 500 three years ago with Chip Ganassi Racing, but this year he was one of the first out by crashing on the first lap. Now here comes Team Arrow McLaren.
