NASCAR/INDY CAR Report by Barrie Lee

8/11

After two full weeks of the Paris Olympics, we finally are able to see a Nascar race in Richmond, Va. The race itself was mediocre at best. JGR cars ran up front during the first two stages and seemed to dominate the field. But things changed during stage 3, and it seemed like having two choices of tires from Goodyear might have made the difference. The standard tire is a harder compound, but they also supplied a softer version with red lettering that allowed the cars to have greater grip without the longevity of the regular tires. It made a huge difference and it was shown by Daniel Suarez in the #99 car for Trackhouse Racing. He put these red lettered tires on during the 2nd stage and went from the back of the field to the front in short order. The main excitement of the race was during the last 10 laps of the 3rd stage. Austin Dillon, RCR owners grandson moved to the front of the field in his #3 Chevy Camaro and passed the leader, Denny Hamlin. Denny has won 6 of these cup races in Richmond and lives in Va. It looked like Austin might just win his first race in 2 or 3 years. But the #41 Mustang caused a caution and a 4 lap shootout was the outcome. Joey Logano lined up next to Dillon and got the jump on the #3 on the restart. Hamlin was right behind Dillon and Tyler Reddick was

behind Joey. As the flag dropped, Joey got ahead of Dillon and gained a four car lead during the final lap. Dillon flew into the final corner with more speed than he should have used if he planned to make the turn. But his goal was to wreck Joey, which he did and made the turn while also knocking Denny into the inside wall. He went on to cross the finish line first. Joey was fuming and Hamlin was not happy either. During an interview after the race, Joey referred to the act as "chicken s—t". He then walked to the Nascar office to make a formal complaint. The broadcasters let it be known that they heard the radio from Dillon's crew chief during that lap and the crew chief told Dillon to "wreck him". If Nascar follows their normal protocol, we should hear by Tuesday night that Dillon was disqualified from the win, and Joey Logano or Denny Hamlin should be given the win. It will also cause fines for Richard Childress Racing, Richard Childress himself for lying about the incident, major fines for Austin Dillon and a suspension for Dillon's crew chief. If Nascar doesn't clear this up, immediately, the outcome will be a major problem in the future. Believe me.

8/18

Nascar did penalize Austin Dillon for last week's race in Richmond, Va. He kept the win but it won't put him in the playoffs. His crew chief has been suspended for three races, and his team fined. Joey Logano was fined \$50,000 for his rant in the pits after the race. He apologized and said he was good with the fine. Yesterday, IndyCar had a race in Madison, II. Just east of St. Louis, Ms. Great entertainment. NBC again screwed up the telecast, but I'm used to it. Joseph Newgarden spun and won. Will Power had a power failure on a restart and crashed out of the race with help from Alexander Rossi in his Team Arrow McLaren. Second place went to Scott McLaughlin in his Team Penske #3 Dalara, 3rd was rookie Linus Lundqvist in a Chip Gannassi #8 Dalara. Colton Herta was 4th but was penalized and moved to 5th, allowing Alex Palou to move up to 4th. Really nice to have IndyCar back in action after a month of inactivity due to NBC.

8/24

History was made today at the Daytona 400 race in Florida. The Woods Brothers won their 100th race in the cup series with Harrison Burton driving. This team is legendary for many reasons. They have had some of the best drivers in Nascar history drive their cars. David Pearson, Bobby Allison, AJ Foyt, and many more won for this team. They were hired by Colin Chapman when he brought his rear engine Lotus to Indy in 1967 and won Indy on his first attempt with Jimmy Clark as his driver. The first rear engine car to win the biggest race of all. If you saw Ford vs Ferrari, they were mentioned by Carol Shelby during the efforts to win at LeMans. Holman and Moody was another Nascar team that used the Woods Brothers to pit their cars and Carol asked his team why their cars were pitting quicker than his? They said it was because they were using a Nascar team. (The Woods Brothers). David Pearson won several Nascar championships with this team and that was quite an accomplishment since The Woods Brothers only ran a limited schedule until they became a satellite team of Team Penske. Rick Hendricks Motorsports has the most wins in Nascars cup series, with 310 wins. He surpassed Richard Petty, Team Penske, and RCR for that title. But Rick has run 4 cars for most of their history. Richard Petty, Roger Penske, and others only ran one car during the first few decades of their involvement in Nascar. Roger moved up to two cars in the 1980s and Richard had his son, Kyle join his team about the same time. RCR continues with two cars today, Team Penske has been running three cars for the past decade and Richard Petty Racing has sold his team to Jimmy Johnson's Legacy Motor Club team with two drivers. Jimmy jumps into a car for his team a couple of times a year. IndyCar runs at Portland, OR today but I will cover that race next month due to the length of this column.
