### 6 Branch 129 Historical Tidbits Submitted by Cris Andrews

#### \*Dick Gray: First Big SIR

SIR (Sons in Retirement) Branch 129 in Redding was established in 1985 with a mission to provide a social environment for retired men to share experiences, foster friendships, and engage in various activities. The early years of the branch saw a modest group of retirees who met regularly to discuss their interests and plan social gatherings. As word of the group spread, membership began to grow, and the branch in the early years enjoyed a membership of over 200 men.

As SIR Branch 129 gained popularity, it expanded its activities to include a wide range of interests. The branch also started organizing monthly luncheons, where guest speakers were invited to share their knowledge on assorted topics. Branch 129 met at the Moose Lodge, Win River, and the Elks Lodge. These luncheons quickly became a highlight for members, providing a platform for learning and camaraderie. Branch 129's first Big Sir (now called President) was Dick Gray. Jokingly, it was rumored that the vote was

two-to-nothing, with Dick not voting.

According to a "SIR Profile" in an old Branch 129 newsletter called "SIR'S UPDATE", Dick was born in Oregon and the family moved to Kansas City, San Francisco and many other places. After high school Dick attended Baker University until WWII broke out. He enlisted in the Navy and rose to the rank of Captain. After the war he returned to college earning his degree. After college he worked for the Social Security Administration where he was employed for 33 years. He ended his career at the Redding office and was well known in the community. One day in 1965, Dick was playing golf with Bob St Clair and Mel Stromberg Badge #14 when they invited him to a meeting in Chico to discuss an interesting organization named SIR. And the result was the beginning of Branch 129 in Redding with Dick Gray as Big Sir for 1985 and 1986.
