I want to thank all the members of Branch 129 for their participation in our SIR Branch and a special thanks to 2025 President Barrie Lee for his steadfast leadership in 2025! And as Secretary and Historian, I want our 2026 President, Morgan Akin, to know that I look forward to working with him to help our branch grow and prosper in 2026!

In the January 1998 "SIR'S UPDATE", Big Sir John Merrill wrote that the 1998 SIR Membership Directory would be ready for members to pick up their copy at the January meeting. He said "...for many years we have enjoyed one of the best directories in the entire SIR organization. This year we have made it even better with an important change because the Directory only lists those who are full members at the time of printing. Beginning in 1998 we will publish a Directory Addendum every three months listing changes to our membership in three categories: 1. Former Members who have been dropped, 2.
