#### FOCUS ON SIR BEC (BOARD) MEMBERS


#### Michael Lynn

After college he went to work for Stokley-Van Kamp, the vegetable and bean processing company in Indianapolis for 13 years. He met his wife, Debi there.


In 1984 they moved to this area and worked for 29 years, Pacific Coast Producers, rising from controller to Vice President of Finance.

# Little Known and Surprising Facts About Golf

Oldest Sport Club	Company of Edinburgh Golfers founded in 1744
Origin of the Word "Golf"	From the Dutch word "kolf," meaning "club." (Why Dutch?*)
Oldest Golf Course	"Old Course" at St. Andrews, Scotland, dates to 15th century
Originally 22 Holes	In 1784 several short holes of the "Old Course" were combined
First Golf Balls	Leather stuffed with feathers; modern standard set in 1921
Golf Ball Dimples	Standard: 300-500, they reduce air resistance to improve flight
First Woman Golfer	Mary, Queen of Scots (1542-1587)
Banned by James II	Because it interfered with the archery practice of Scottish King
Most Expensive Round	About \$1,000 at Shadow Creek Golf Course in Las Vegas
Longest Hole	1,097 yard, par 7, 3rd hole at South Korea's Gunsan Country Club
Longest Recorded Drive	515 yards by Mike Austin in 1974
Shortest PGA Tour Hole	106-yard, par 3, 7th hole at Pebble Beach Golf Links
Longest Recorded Putt	401 feet, 2 inches by Jay Stocki in 2023 at Kohler Putting Course
Hole-in-One Probability	12,500 to 1 for average golfer, 58 years of weekly 18-hole rounds
Youngest Hole-in-Oner	5-year-old Coby Orr in 1975
Human Lightning Rods	More golfers struck by lightning than players in any other sport

<sup>\*</sup> The medieval Dutch stick-and-ball game of *kolf* resembled early forms of golf. *Kolf* was popular in the Netherlands at a time of significant cultural exchange with Scotland. The Scots adapted the game (*Gowf* in Scots Gaelic) to their landscapes and rules, and it eventually evolved into the modern game of golf.

After graduating from Stagg High School, Steve attended San Joaquin Delta College, then transferred to Chico State.





St. Andrew

One of the twelve disciples, Andrew was born to a Jewish family in Galilee. He was a fisherman who was called to become a "fisher of men." He also became a "fisher of women" and converted the wife of the Roman governor of Achaia (today Greece). For doing that, he was martyred around 60 CE. According to tradition, he was crucified on an X-shaped cross, known as a "saltire." Legend relates that a monk named Regulus received instructions in a dream to take some of Andrew's bones to the "ends of the earth." He set sail from Byzantium (today Constantinople), heading west toward the edge to known world, and was shipwrecked in the area now known as St. Andrews in Fife, Scotland, where he presented the relics to Pictish King Óengus mac Fergusa (729–761). The area became a significant religious center, with a cathedral built to house the Saint's relics. St. Andrew became the patron saint of Scotland, which adopted his saltire cross as a national symbol on Scotland's flag. The Saint's namesake town is recognized as the birthplace of golf with its famous Old Course St. Andrew's, which also honors the Apostle.


